I SEND you herewith, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copies of Two Letters from Captain Nourle, of His Majesty's Sloop Cyane, giving an Account of the Capture of a Privateer of Eight Guns and Eighty-four Men, and Recapture of a valuable Guineaman.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Warehouses without Payment of Duty," it is (amongst other Things) enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees, of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table hereunto annexed, marked (A), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant in any Warehouse or Warehouses situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Customs or Excise due on the Importation thereof, subject, nevertheless, to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by this Act; provided always, that no such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be so lodged or secured, unless and until such Warehouses, and other Works belonging or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the same shall be fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same may respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Act; and the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorized and empowered, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of such Warehouses, which Certificate shall be published Three Times at least in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London."

We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, certify and make known, that the

following Warehouses belonging to the West India Dock Company are so far completed, that in our Judgment the same are fit and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament, marked (A), and wherein the same may respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act, viz. And as, by Act of Parliament, passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy;" it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer, who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy in London to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act, Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 31st December 1803 will commence paying on the 19th Instant; and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above directed.
