WHEREAS by an AA, passed in the last Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An AA " for permitting certain Goods imported into Great " Britain to be fecured in Warehoule without Pay-"ment of Duty," it is (amongft other Things) enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the "Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, " Confignee or Confignees, of any of the Goods, "Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or defcribed " in the Table hereunto annexed, marked (A), and " which shall be legally imported and brought into ** the Port of London, to lodge and fecure the fame " under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the Mer-" chant in any Warehoufe or Warehoufes fituated " at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the Weft " India Dock Company, without Payment at the "Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, of the Duties of Customs or ", Excife due on the Importation thereof, fubject, " neverthelefs, to the Rules, Regulations, and Re-" Itrictions directed by this Act; provided always, "that no fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandize fail be fo lodged or fecured, unlefs and until fuch Warchoufes, and other Works belong-" ing or to belong thereto, shall be fo far com-" pleted, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High " Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majetty's "Treafury for the Time being, or any Three or "more of them, the fame fhall be fit and proper in "every Refpect for the Reception of fuch Goods, " Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the fame " may refpectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, " and remain under the Regulatious and Directions " of this Act; and the Lord High Treasurer, or " the Commissioners of His Majelty's Treasury for "the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorized and empowered, by Writing ander his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and the make known his or their Approbation of fock Majefly's Effablifument in that Bebalf;

"Warehoufes, which Certificate shall be published " Three Times at least in the London Gazette, and " in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then " usually circulated in London :"

We, the underligned Lords Commillioners of His Majefty's Treasury, do, in pursuance of the said A& of Parliament; certify and make known, that the following Warehoufes belonging to the Well India Dock Company are fo far completed, that in our Judgment the fame are fit and proper in every Refpect for the Reception of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and defcribed in the faid Table annexed to the faid Act of Parliament, marked (A), and wherein the fame may refpectively be fafely and fecurely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act, viz. All those Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses adjoining each other, and fituate on the North Side of the large Dock belonging to the Weft India Dock Company at the Ifle of Dogs, forming the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the faid Dock, from the Welt End to the East End thereof, and we do hereby declare our Approbation of the faid feveral Warehoufes accordingly.
