After which the List will be recalled the first and third Wednesday in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them; and not only bring with them the Affidavit required touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance, required by Act of Parliament, to His present Majesty; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by. When Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave before the Half-Pay can be paid.

And as, by Act of Parliament, passed in the Thirty-fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy;" it is enacted by the 20th Clause of the said Act, that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer, who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near to the Place of his Residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy in London to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the Place of his Residence, in the Manner pointed out by the said Act, Notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay ending the 31st December 1803 will commence paying on the 19th Instant; and all Persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them may apply as above directed.

The Commissioners appointed at this Office for carrying into Effect the Act for granting to His Majesty a Contribution from Profits arising from Property, Professions, &c. do hereby give Notice, that, on Account of the Difficulty which attends procuring Returns, they will not, in the present Instance, make a Reduction of more than the reduced Scale of the Tax from the Half-Pay of Officers in the Navy. But the full Rate of One Shilling in the Pound will be hereafter charged against such Officers as shall omit to make the Return required by the Act of Parliament to entitle them to the reduced Scale of Tax.
