SIR, 7E have the Honor to inform your Excellency, that notwithstanding the past violent and unwarrantable Proceedings of the People of the Fort, they have at last become a little more reafonable, from our repeatedly telling them that any further Refiftance on their Part would avail thein nothing, but, on the contrary, would exafperate your Excellency and the Troops under your Command to as to exterminate the Whole of them, if a Storm Their Commandants have confequently took Place. come to us this Forenoon in a Body, and requeited of us to forward to your Excellency the accummanying Proposal for the Surrender of the Fort, to which their respective Names are affixed.

Should any unforefeen Deviation from their Propofal take Place, as we are still their Prioners, we Hope your Excellency will not impute to us the Blame.

Their Propofal is to deliver up the Fort, Guns, Stores, &c. to your Excellency, at any Time after the Receipt of this you may think proper; Protection to themfelves and private Property, after delivering up the Sircar's Arms and Property; and be allowed to remain in the City, or to go wherever their Families may be.

My Lord,

HAVE the Pleafure to inform your Lordinio, A that the important Fortrels of Agra, termed by the Natives The Key of Hindoltan, capitulated lat Night, and the Garrifon, confiding of between Fire and Six Thousand Men, marched out at Noon this Day, when the Place was immediately occupied by our Troops under the Command of Brigaelle-Gene-ral Macdonald.

The only Terms required by the Garrifon, were Protection to their Perfons and private Property, which was agreed to on my Part.

I attribute the early Surrender of this Place to the great Impression our Breaching Betterics, which opened Yefterday Morning within Three Hundred and Fifty Yards, made on the Walls, and which would have cauled a practicable Breach in a few Hours more battering.

To Colonei Horfeford of the Artillery, gad Captain Woul of the Corps of Engineers, 23 well as to every other Officer in those two Corps; I feel mylelf under great Obligations for their unremitted Exertions on this Occasion, and to which I the desired attribute my early Success against this Pace.

I have the Pleafure to fay, our Lofs that the Construction of the Batteries has been very trilling. Three European Artillery Mon, and These Genue danze killed, are the only Czinzlies.
