TO OFFICERS ON HALF PAY.

War-Office, May 10, 1804. A LL Officers on the Half Pay of the Land Forces, whether resident in Great Britain, Ircland, or the adjacent Islands, are hereby required immediately to transmit to the Secretary at War, an Account, in Writing, of their Age, pail Services, Rank, and prefent Place of Abode; and fuch as think themselves, from Age or Insirmities, unfit for further Service, even in this Country, are to accompany their Reports with sufficient Vouchers of their Inability, and the Causes thereof.

The Officers on Half Pay who are serving in the Militia, Fencibles, or Volunteers, are to specify the Commission, which they respectively hold, and those otherwise employed under Government, the Nature of the public Situation, which they possess.

Every fuch Officer who shall neglect to make his Report within one Month from the Date hereof, will be confidered as otherwife provided for, or dead, and his Name will be ftruck off the Half Pay Liit accordingly.
