ried her after a stout Resistance of Ten Minutes from the Crew, confifting, when boarded, of Fortynine Men, well prepared to receive them, and obliged afterwards to tow and fweep her out in a dead Calm, under a heavy Fire from the Enemy's Batteries, as also the Musketry from the Shore: The Matter affures me that the very gallant Conduct of the Men, together with the Assistance of the Surgeon, in Oppolition to all Difficulties, enabled him to execute this Service. She proves to be Le Rofe Schooner Privateer, carrying Fifty Men, well armed, and One long Brafs Nine-Pounder ; fails extremely faft, well found, and victualled complete for Three Months for Fifty Men ; just going on a Cruize.

SIR, J DEG leave to enclose you, for the Information Il of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a Letter I have received from Captain Younghufhand, of His Majefty's Sloop Ofprey, giving an Account of a molt spirited Action he fought with the Egyptienne, a French Frigate of Thirty-fix Guns and Two Hundred and Sixty Men, which mult certainly have fallen to his fuperior Skill and Bravery, had not fhe availed herfelf of her failing, Captain Younghusoaud's gallant to get away. Conduct, with that of his Officers and Men, against fuch fuperior Force, merits my warmelt Applaufe.

This Ship was formerly the Railleure, and given to the Merchants of Bourdeaux, to fit out as a private Ship of War; flie had made feveral Captures, one of which has been retaken by the Hippomenes,

His Majefly's Shop Ofprey, Barbadoes, March £8, 1803.

SIR, BEG leave to inform you, that on the 23d In-itant, I difeovered Four Sail on the S. W. Quarter; 1 immediately chaecd, and upon nearing them, I found them to be a large Frigate and Three Mer-chaft Ships; upon coming within Hail of the Fri-gate, the holided French Colours, and fired her Broadfide, which was inftantly returned, and the Two Ships continued in close Action for an Hour and Twenty Minutes, when the Enemy ceafed firing, and began to make off, and her Convoy to feparate on different Courfes; I then found with Regret, that the outfailed the Ofprey under her Topfails upon the Cap; I however continued the Chace firing our Bow Chacers as long as they could reach,

but we loft Sight of her during the Night. The French Ship's Sails, Rigging, and Hull were very much cut; the Ofprey has also fuffered very much in her Sails and Rigging; and I am forry to add, that we have one Man killed and Sixteen wounded.

Lieut. Collier, the Officers, and Ship's Company ischaved with the greatest Bravery and Activity.



I have further to inform you, that on the 25th, the Ofprey and Hippomenes retook the Ship Reliance, and I am informed from the French Prize-Maller, that the Ship the Ofprey engaged, was the Frigate Egyptienne, fitted out as a Privateer by the Merchants of Bourdeaux, mounting Thirty-fix Guns, and having on board Two Hundred and Fifty-I am, Sir, &c. No doubt the fpirited Action of the Ofprey contributed ; of which Captain Shipley speaks in the handsomest Terms.

SIR, March 29, 1804. HAVE the Honor to acquaint you with the Capture of L'Egyptienne French Privateer (formerly a Republican Frigate), mounting Thirty-fix Guns, Twelves and Nines, commanded by M. Placiard, and having Two Hundred and Forty Men on board, on the Evening of the 27th, after an arduous Chace of Fifty-four Hours, and a running Fight of Three Hours and Twenty Minutes, by His Majefty's Sloop under my Command, for the ftruck the Moment we fairly got alongfide of her. I feel much Pleafure in faying the Officers and Men behaved with that Coolnefs and Intrepidity inherent in Englishmen; and had the Enemy allowed them a Trial alonglide I am convinced her superior Force would not have availed them much. However, I cannot forbear recommending to your Protection my First Lieutenant, for kis good Conduct on this as on all former Occalions. The flight Refulance she made I can only attribute to the Fear of being as feverely beat as fhe had been Four Days previous by the Ofprey, who killed Eight of her Men and wounded Nineteen, and whole Gallantry attonished them Mr. John Lloyd, Master's Mate, is the only Perfon hurt on this Occation, and he flightly.

I have farther to inform you of the Recapture of the Reliance of London, taken by the above Frigate.
