The King has been pleaſed to grant unto Charles Wynne Finch, of Cefnamwlch, in the County of Carnarvon, and of Voëlas, in the County of Denbigh, in the Principality of Wales, Eſq; eldeſt Son of the Honorable Jane Finch by the Honorable Charles Finch (Brother of Heneage Earl of Aylesford) her Huſband, and preſumptive Heir to the Eſtates of his late Kinſman John Griffith, of Cefnamwlch aforeſaid, Eſq; deceaſed, and to thoſe of his maternal Grandfather Watkin Wynne, late of Voëlas aforeſaid, Eſq; alſo deceaſed, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Iſſue may take and uſe the Surnames of Griffith Wynne, and alſo bear the Arms of the ſaid Families of Griffith and Wynne, in lieu of the Surname and Arms of the Family of Finch; ſuch Arms being firſt duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office:

And alſo to order, that this His Maſteſty's Conceſſion and Declaration be regiſtered in His College of Arms.
