Bank of England, July 19, 1804. THE Court of Directors of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England hereby give Notice,

That, one the 10th Day of July instant, an Act of Parliament was passed, wherein, after reciting, that the faid Governor and Company had, for the Convenience of the Public, caused to be coined or stamped and circulated, a large Quantity of Silver Dollars, it was enacted, That if any Person or Persons shall, after the palling of the said Act, make, coin, or counterfeit, or cause or procure to be made, coined, or counterfeited, or willingly act or affift in the making, coining, or counterfeiting any Coin resembling, or made with Intent to resemble or look like the faid Dollars, or to pass as such, or shall bring into the United Kingdom any such falle or counterfeit Dollars, knowing the fame to be falle or counterfeited, every Person so offending, and being thereof convicted, shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and shall be transported for any Term

of Years not exceeding Seven Years. And further, That if any Person shall utter, or tender in Payment, or give in Exchange, or pay, or put off any such false or counterfeit Dollars, knowing the same to be false or counterfeited, he or she shall, for the first Offence, suffer Six Months Imprisonment, and find Sureties for his or her good Behaviour for Six Months more; for the Second Offence, Two Years Imprisonment, and find Security for good Behaviour for Two Years more; and for the Third Offence, shall be adjudged, guilty of Felony, and be transported for Fourteen Years.

And if any Person shall have in his or her Custody, without lawful Excuse, (the Proof whereof shall lie upon the Party accused,) any greater Number than Five of such counterfeit Dollars, he or she shall, upon Conviction, forfeit the same, which shall be cut in Pieces, and for every such Offence the Offender shall pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds, nor less than Two Pounds for every such counterfeit Dollar; and in case such Penalty shall not be forthwith paid, the Offender shall be committed to the Common Gaol or House of Correction, to be kept to hard Labour for Three Months, or until the Penalty be paid.
