Notice is hereby given, that an Application is intended to be made to Parliament at the next Sessions, for Leave to bring in a Bill for the Purpose of renewing, altering, amending, and extending the Powers of Two several Acts of Parliament, the one passed in the Sixth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for making and maintaining a Navigable Cut or Canal from the River Severn, between Bewdley and Tilton Brook, in the County of Worcester, to cross the River Trent at or near Heywood-Mill, in the County of Stafford, and to communicate with a Canal intended to be made between the said River Trent and the River Mersey;" and the other passed in the Tenth Year of His said Majesty's Reign, to explain and amend the said Act, and for granting further Powers for that Purpose; the said Bill being intended to empower the Company of Proprietors of the said Cut or Canal to make such Cuts, Sluices, Works, Basons, Weirs, and other Works as they shall think necessary, from and out of the said Cut or Canal, or the Basons adjoining thereto, to join and form a further Communication with the River Severn, in the Hamlet of Lower Mitton, in the Parish of Kidderminster, and County of Worcester, and also to vary or alter the said Cut or Canal in the Parish of Womborn, in the County of Stafford; and also to make an additional Feeder or Feeders, Reservoir or Reservoirs, with Cuts, Feeders, Channels, or Conveyances for the Purposes of feeding or supplying the said Cut or Canal with Water from such Reservoir or Reservoirs, in or through the several Parishes, Liberties, Townships, and extra-parochial Places of Codfall, Great Saredon, Little Saredon, Shareshill, Cheslyn-Hay, otherwise Cheslyn-Common, Great Wyrley, Wyrley-Bank, Cannock, Hatherton, and Wolverhampton, or some of them, in the County of Stafford; and also to empower the said Company of Proprietors, or other Person or Persons with the Consent of the said Company, to make a Railway or Railways, or a Collateral Cut or Cuts, from and out of the said Cut or Canal, to Mines lying adjacent or contiguous thereto; and also to empower the said Company of Proprietors to raise Money by Mortgage of the Tolls of the said Cut or Canal, or otherwise, for the Purposes aforesaid; and to regu-
