The King has been graciously pleased to grant unto Sir Robert Gore, of Liffadel, in the County of Sligo, in that Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, called Ireland, and of Salford, in the County Palatine of Lancaster, Baronet, only surviving Son of Sir Booth Gore, and Heir to his Brother Sir Booth Gore, both late of Liffadel aforesaid, Baronets, deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority, that he and his Issue may take and use the Surname, and bear the Arms of Booth, in Addition to the Surname and Arms of Gore. in Compliance with the Limitations contained in the Will of his late Uncle John Gore Booth, late of Salford aforesaid, Esquire, deceased: Such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office:

And also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms, otherwise to be void and of none Effect.

**N**otice is hereby given, that, in consequence of an intended Extension of the Darwent Navigation from Malton to Yedingham Bridge, (at the

Request of several Proprietors of Lands adjoining to the said River,) Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for an Act for making and maintaining a Navigable Cut or Canal, with proper Towing Paths, branching from the said River Darwent at or near its Junction with the River Rye, near Wykeham, in the Parish of Old Malton Westward, to and into the Parish of Nunnington, in the said County of York; and that the said Cut or Canal is proposed to be made and to pass in or near unto the Course of the said River Rye, through or into the several Parishes and Townships of Old Malton, Wykeham, Pickering, Pickering Marshes, Kirbysperton, Ryton, Great Habton, Little Habton, Appleton in the Street; Broughton, Swinton, Amotherby, Barton in the Street, Butterwick, Salton, Brawby, Slingsby, Edstone, North Holme, Hovingham, East Nels, Stonegrave, West Nels, and Nunnington aforesaid, all in the said County of York; and also for making and maintaining another Navigable Cut or Canal, with proper Towing Paths, branching from the said River Rye at or near its Junction with the River Severn near Little Habton, in the said Parish of Kirbysperton Northwards, to Normanby Bridge, in the Parish of Normanby, in the said County of York; and that the said last-mentioned Cut or Canal is proposed to be made and to pass in or near unto the Course of the said River Severn, through or into the several Parishes and Townships of Kirbysperton, Little Habton, Great Barugh, Normanby, Salton, and Brawby aforesaid; and also for making and maintaining another Navigable Cut or Canal, with proper Towing Paths, branching from the said River Darwent at or near its Junction with a certain Brook or Stream of Water called Thornton Beck, in the Parishes of Ellerburn and Thornton, in the said County of York, and Pickering aforesaid, or some or one of them, to the said Town of Thornton; and that the said last-mentioned Cut or Canal is proposed to be made, and to pass in or near unto the Course of the said Beck, through or into the Parishes and Townships of Ellerby, Farmanby, Thornton, otherwise Thornton cum Farmanby, and Pickering aforesaid, or some or one of them.
