HEREWITH transmit you a Letter from Captain Pearle, of His Majefty's Sloop Haleyon, dated the 23d of September laft, giving an Account of his having captured L'Esperance French Privatser, on the 20th of that Month, which you will be pleafed to lay before the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty for their Information; and at the fame Time acquaint their Lordships, that Captain Pearle's Exertions on the prefent, and feveral former Occalions, for the Protection of our Trade, and Destruction of the Enemy's Privateers in the Vicinity of Gibraltar, very justly entitles him to my avarment Approbation.

His Majefly's Sloop Halcyon, off Gibraltar-My LORD, Bay, September 23, 1804.

HAVE the Honor to inform your Lordship, that, on the 20th Instant, being on my Way from this Place to Tangier, I discovered feveral Sail .to the Westward, one a Settee boarding a Brig; I made all Sail poffible, with a very light Air from the Eaftward; and it is with Pleafure I inform your Lordship, after Eight Hours' Chafe, inceffantly pulling, and Boats towing against a strong Current, we got within Gun-shot. After exchanging our Bow, and the her Stern Chafers, (now and then a Broadfiele,) the flruck her Colours, and proved to be L'Efperance French Privateer of Nice, Captain Joseph Lebouis, picrced for Twelve Guns, but only Ten mounted, of different Calibres, from Twenty-fours to Twelves; had on board Fifty-four Men, but, owing to its being quite dark, Twenty-two made their efcape in Boats before we took Poffeffion. I am happy to fay we had not any one hart. Our Rigging and Sails fultained a little Damage. L'Efperance had Two wounded, and feveral Shot in her Hull, Mails, and Yards. I beg Leave to mention to your Lordship she is the fame Privateer that captured the Swift Cutter, Fortitude Merchant Brig, and Three Letters of Marque belonging to Gibraltar; she is the largest and best equipped of the Kind I have yet seen. My Officers and Ship's Company on this, as well as on fimilar Occafions, acted with that Zeal and Perfeverance that deferves my warmelt Praife. I have, &c. H. W. PEARSE.
