Objects deserving of His Majesty's Royal Bounty.

And it is hereby notified, that all the Private Men on the Out-Pension of Chelsea-Hospital, refiding in South Britain, exclusive of Wales, discharged as aforesaid, (except as above excepted,) who shall not appear at the Times and Places herein appointed, will be considered by Government as otherwise provided for, or as dead, and they will accordingly be firuck off the Books of the Out Pension of the said Hospital, without any Prospect of being restored thereto
