That a General Embargo or Stop be made of all Spanish Ships and Vessels whatsoever, now within, or which hereafter shall come into, any of the Ports, Harbours, or Roads within the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, together with all Persons and Effects on board the faid Ships and Vessels ; but that the utmost Care be taken for the Preserva tion of all and every Part of the Cargoes on board any of the faid Ships, so that no Damage or Embezzlement whatever be sustained: -- And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may re-Steph. WHEREAS His Majesty was graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of May One thousand eight hundred and thee, to promise and declare, that the Bounties of Five Pounds for every Able Seaman, and Two Pounds Ten Shillings for every Ordinary Seaman, fit for His Majesty's Service, should be paid in the Manner thereby directed to every fuch Able and Ordinary Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should, on or before the Thirtieth Day of June then following, enter themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, either with the Captains or Lieutenants of His Majesty's Ships or Veffels, or Officers employed on Shore for raifing Men for the Service of the Royal Navy: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His said Proclamation, to declare, that all Ablebodied Landmen, not above the Age of Thirty-five nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should so enter themselves as aforesaid, should receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also graciously pleased, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thousand eight hundred and three, to promise and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every Able and Ordinary Seaman, sit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Scaman or Scamen, who might conceal him or High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden

be taken for His Majesty's Service, by any of His Majesty's Sea-Officers employed for raising Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamations for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty-first Day of this instant December; and it being judged expedient for His Majetty's Service, that the faid Bounties and Reward should be continued to be paid for some Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Time limited for Payment of the said Bounties and Reward be prolonged and extended from the faid Thirty-first Day of this instant December to the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and five, inclusive; whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly.

JHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Sixth Day of June last, for prohibiting the Exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying Coastwife, Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammu-nition, will expire upon the Sixth Day of this instant December: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Sasety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever, (except the Master General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service,) do at any Time, during the Space of Six Months, to commence from the faid Sixth Day of this inflant December, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom, or carry Coastwife, any Gunpowder/ or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Gunpowder or Salt-Petre, or any Sort of Arms or Ammunition, on board any Ship or Vessel in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, or carrying the same Coastwife, without Leave or Permission in that Behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring and fuffering the respective Forfeitures and Penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled "An "Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the "Exportation of Salt-Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gundander, or any Sort of "American American and all to the exportation of Gundander of the exportation of Gundander "Arms or Ammunition; and also to empower His Majelty to restrain the carrying Coastwise of "Salt-Petre, Gunpowder, or any Sort of Arms or "Ammunition:"—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury. the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord
