WE, whose Names are hereunder-written, being Five of the Commissioners named and authorised in and by His Majesty's Commission under the Great Seal of Great Britain, bearing Date at Westminster the 19th Day of November 1804, do by virtue of the said Commission, and in pursuance of an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to vest certain Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, in Trustees, for better securing His Majesty's Docks, Ships, and Stores, at Chatham, and for the Use of His Majesty's Ordnance at Warley Common and Woolwich," hereby give Notice to all and every Persons and Person who have, or claim to have any Estate, Right, Title, or Interest to, or in the Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments hereinafter particularly set forth, that it is to say—All that Messuage, Tenement, or Farm-House, commonly called or known by the Name of Upberry, together with the Barns, Stables, Outhouses, Buildings, Yards, Gardens, and Appurtenances thereunto belonging and therewith now used, containing together, by Admeasurement, 2 Acres, 1 Rood, and 37 Perches, or thereabouts; and also all that Piece or Parcel of Land, called Little Mead, containing, by Admeasurement, 1 Acre, 3 Roods, and 3 Perches, or thereabouts; and also all that Piece or Parcel of Arable Land, called the Fourteen Acres, containing, by Admeasurement, 13 Acres, 3 Roods, and 36 Perches, or thereabouts; and also all that other Piece or Parcel of Land, called Lucern Mead, containing, by Admeasurement, 2 Acres, 1 Rood, and 4 Perches, or thereabouts; and also all that other Piece or Parcel of Land, called the Four Acres, containing, by Admeasurement, 3 Acres and 28 Perches, or thereabouts; and also all that other Piece or Parcel of
