Port Towns, or in any other Places on the Coafts of this Kingdom, whether they may themfelves be liable toQuarantine or otherwife, as they tender the Prefervation of their own Lives, and the Safety and Wel-fare of all the Inhabitants of this Kingdom, most fcrupuloufly to obferve all the Laws of Quarantine which now are or may hereafter be in Force, and all Orders made by Us, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Privy Council, under the Authority thereof; and particularly most carefully to avoid any Communication with any Ship or Vellel, or with any Perfon or Perfons coming therein, from or through the Mediterranean, or from the West Barbary, on the Atlantic Ocean, or from Cadiz, or other Parts of Spain without the Streights, lying to the Southward of Cape St. Vincent, or from any Place to which, by Our Royal Proclamation, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, or by Our Orders in Council, the Laws of Quarantine are; or may hereafter, be extended; or with any Boat or Perfon therein, coming from or having been on board any fuch Ship, until fuch Ship, Veffel, or Boat, with the Crews and Perfons on board, and the Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes imported therein, shall have performed their Quarantine, in fuch Places and Manner as are or shall hereafter be directed in that Behalf, and until they respectively shall have been duly discharged therefrom : And We do further strictly exhort, enjoin, and command all Magistrates and Persons in Authority, and all others Our loving Subjects, without Lols of Time, to give Information to Us, through Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department; or to Our Privy Council, of any Perfons that they may know or be-Lounch, of any rerions that they may know of de-lieve to have offended againft any of the faid Laws or Orders, and We do hereby warn all Perfons whom it may concern, that We have given the ftrickell Orders for enforcing, with the utmost Ri-gour, the most punctual Observance of the Laws of Quarantine, and all the Orders, Rules, and Regula-tions Detrive therete it briese Our for Detriving tions relating thereto, it being Our firm Determination, upon ferious Confideration of the great Extent of Milery and Calamity which a fingle Inflance of improvidently neglecting any of thele Regulations may bring upon Our loving Subjects, to caufe the feveral Penaltics which the Law has provided, or

may provide, to be inflicted upon all those who may be guilty of any Offence against the fame : And whereas it is allo neceffary to take the ut-

\*molt Precastion to prevent the foreading of Infection, in café the faid malignant Difeafe, or any other of a contagious Nature, (which God, in His Merey, avert!) fhould unhappily manifelt itfelf in any Part of Our United Kingdom, notwithflanding the Precautions taken to guard against the Introduction thereof, We have thought fit, by and with the Adwice of Our faid Council, to take Measures for the Establishment of a Board of Health, to confiss of Men able, learned, eminent, and experienced in the Study and Practice of Physic, together with Perfons most capable, from their Knowlege of the Ports of Our Kingdoms, to afford Afilitance in the forming of Regulations respectively applicable to the local Circumstances of the faid Ports; such Board to be authorized and directed to prepare and digest the best Rules and Regulations for the Ipacedy and effectual Adoption of the most approved Methods of guarding against the Introduction and spreading af Infection, and for purifying any Ship or House,

or any Place in which any contagious Diforder may have manifested itself, and to communicate the same to all Magistrates, Medical Persons, and others of Our loving Subjects, who may be defirous, and may apply to be made acquainted therewith; and We most strictly enjoin and command all Magistrates and Persons in Authority, all Medical Persons, and others Our loving Subjects, especially those within the Maritime Counties, to give immediate Notice to Us, through Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, or Our Privy Council, in cale any Perfon or Perfons fnould be attacked with any Fever, attended with new and uncommon Symptoms, fuch as to afford Ground for Apprehenfion that fuch Fever is of the fame Nature as the Diforder prevailing in feveral Parts of Spain, and in Gibraltar, in order that the moft immediate and effectual Measures may be taken, as well for affording due and necessary Affiltance and Relief to those af-flicted with the fame, as for preventing the Contagion from spreading amongst Our loving Subjects.

## Westminster, February 22, 1805.

THIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage way fent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorifed by virtue of His Majefly's Commission for declaring His Royal Affent to feveral Alls agreed upon by both Houses, do defire the immediate Attendance of the Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and feveral other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Affent to the faid Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for railing the Sum of Three Millions by Loans or Exchequer Bills for the Service of Great Britain for the Year One thousand eight hundred and five.

An Act for explaining and amending an Act made in the Forty-third Year of His prefent Majefly for confolidating certain of the Provisions contained in any Act or Acts relating to the Duties under the Management of the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes, and for amending the same so far as relates to the Power of acting as Commissioners in certain Districts.

An Act to continue, until Six Weeks after the Commencement of the next Seffion of Parliament, an Act made in the last Seffion of Parliament, for continuing an Act to empower the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor or Governors of Ireland, to apprehend and detain fuch Perfons as he or they shall suspect for confpiring against His Majesty's Perfon and Government.

An Act to indemnify fuch Perforts in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themfelves for Offices and Employments, and for extending the Times limited for those Purposes respectively until the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thousand
