AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 21st of March 1805,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the malignant Fever which some Time since prevailed in the City of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, in the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia, and at New Orleans, in the Territory of Louisiana, has totally ceased; His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, and being desirous of removing all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth of November last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, subsequent to the First Day of September preceding, should have cleared out from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louisiana, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this Kingdom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louisiana, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the Fourteenth of November last had not been made; any Thing in the said Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; provided such Ships and Vessels shall have sailed from the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, or Louisiana subsequent to the First Day of January last, and that none of the Crew or other Persons on board have died, or been sick of the said Fever, during the Course of the Voyage:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Of-

fice of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the said respective Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
