The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS it has been represented to His Majefty at this Board, that the malignant Fever which some Time since prevailed in the City of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, in the Town of Darien, in the State of Georgia, and at New Orleans, in the Territory of Louisiana, has to-tally ceased; His Majesty, taking the same into Con-sideration, and being desirous of removing all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Sasety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fourteenth of November last, upon all Ships, Persons, Goods, and Merchandizes, which, subsequent to the First Day of September preceding, should have cleared out from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Louisiana, and had arrived, or which should thereafter arrive, in any of the Ports of this King-dom, or the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, from any of the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, and Lonisiana, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening, and airing, and without performing Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the Fourteenth of November last had not been made; any Thing in the faid Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding; provided such Ships and Vessels shall have sailed from the Ports of South Carolina, Georgia, or Louisiana subsequent to the First Day of January last, and that none of the Crew or other Persons on board have died, or been fick of the faid Fever, during the Course of the Voyage:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master General, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief, for the Time being, of the faid respective Isles of Guernsey, Jer-

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

HEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Ware-"houses without Payment of Duty," it is (amongst other Things) enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Pro-" prietor or Proprietors, Confignee or Confignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize " enumerated or described in the Table hereunto " annexed, marked (A), and which shall be legally inported and brought into the Port of London, " to lodge and fecure the fame, under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any " Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle " of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock "Company, without Payment at the Time of the " first Entry of Such Goods, Wares, and Merchan-" dize of the Duties of Customs or Excise due on " the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to " the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed " by this Act: Provided always, that no fuch " Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be so lodged " or fecured, unless and until such Warehouses and " other Works belonging, or to belong thereto, " shall be so far completed, that in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time " being, or any Three or more of them, the fame " shall be fit and proper in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchan-" dize, and wherein the fame may respectively be " fafely and securely deposited, and remain under " the Regulations and Directions of this Act, and 66 the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners " of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby autho-" rized and empowed, by Writing under his or 46 their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known " his or their Approbation of fuch Warehouses, " which Certificate shall be published Three Times " at leaft, in the London Gazette, and in Two or " more public Morning Newspapers then usually se circulated in London.

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing, Date the 16th Day of March 1804, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, certify and make known, that the following Warehouses belonging to the West India Dock Company, were so far completed, that in their Judgment the same were sitted and proper in every Respect for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize as are enumerated and described in the said Table annexed to the said Act of Parliament, marked (A), and wherein the same might respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of the said Act, viz. All those Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses adjoining each other, and situate on the North Side of the large Dock, belonging to the West India Dock Company, at the Isle of Dogs, forming the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof; and the said Lords Commissioners did thereby declares their Approbation of the said several Warchouses accordingly.

And whereas by the Ninth Section of the faid Act, it is further provided and enacted as follows: . "That if the Lord High Treasurer or the Com--" missioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the . Time being, or any Three or more of them, shall deem it expedient that the Provisions of this Act ". shall be extended to any Goods, Wares, and Mer-" chandize not enumerated or described in either " of the Tables to this Act annexed, and shill cause. " a Lift of fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandize -44. to be published in the London Gazette, then and "from thenceforth all and every the Provisions, Regulations, and Restrictions of this Act shall extend, and be construed to extend to such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, in every Refame had been inserted and enumerated in the 40 faid Tables respectively, at the Time of passing " this Act."

· We the underligned Lords Commillioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to, and in Execution of the Powers vested in us, in and by the faid Act, do hereby declare, that it appears to us to be expedient, that the Provisions of the said Act should be extended to Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies (excepted in Table (B) and nexed to the said Act); and that all Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies, whether the same shall have been shipped on board such Vessels in the West Indies, or elsewhere, may respectively be fafely and fecurely deposited in all or any of the Thirteen Stacks of Warehouses hereinbefore described, and remain therein, under the Regulations and Directions of the faid Act. And we do further declare, that from and after the Publication of this our Certificate, in the London Gazette, conformable to the Directions of the faid Act, all andievery the Provisions, Regulations, and Re-frictions of the faid Act, shall extend, and be conftrued to extend to all such Wines imported in Ships arriving from the West Indies in every Respect in as full and ample a Manner as if the same had been inferted and enumerated in Table (A) ... annexed to the said Act at the Time of the palling
