An Act for amending an Act, passed in the Thirty-seventh Year of His present Majesty, to amend and render more effectual an Act, made in the Thirty-first Year of His late Majesty, for the due making of Bread, and to regulate the Price and Assize thereof; and to punish Persons who shall adulterate Meal, Flour, or Bread, so far as the same relates to the Assize and making of Bread to be sold in the City of London and the Liberties thereof, and within the Weekly Bills of Mortality, and Ten Miles of the Royal Exchange.

An Act to enable Robert Bowyer, of Pall Mall, in the City of Westminster, Esq; to dispose of his Collection of Paintings, Drawings, and Engravings, together with several Copies of certain Books therein-mentioned, by Way of Chance.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts, passed in Fourth and Twenty-fourth Years of His present Majesty, for repairing the Road from Shillingford, in the County of Oxford, through Wallingford and Pangborne, to Reading, in the County of Berks, and for building a Bridge over the River Thames at or near Shillingford Ferry.

An Act for assessing the Proprietors of Lands in the County of Sutherland towards the Expence of making and supporting such Roads and Bridges therein as shall be approved of by the Commissioners appointed by an Act of the Forty-third Year of His present Majesty, for making Roads and building Bridges in the Highlands of Scotland; for making a Turnpike-Road from Portinleik to the Oid, and converting the Statute Labour of the said County into Money.

An Act for continuing the Term, and altering and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts, passed in the Second and Twenty-fourth Years of His present Majesty, for repairing the Roads from Kirkby-Sтивен High-Lane Head, in the County of Westmoreland, through Sedbergh, to Greeta-Bridge, in the County-Palatine of Lancaster, and other Roads therein-mentioned in the said Counties, and in the County of York.

Undress—white or grey Lutestrings, Tabbies, or Damasks.

The Gentlemen to wear black full-trimmed, fringed, or plain Linen, black Swords, and Buckles.

Undress—grey Frocks.

The Court to change the Mourning further on Sunday the 28th Instant, viz.

The Ladies to wear black Silk or Velvet, coloured Ribbons, Fans, and Tippetts, or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver Stuffs, with black Ribbons.

The Gentlemen to wear black Coats, and black or plain white, or white and gold, or white and silver Stuff Waistcoats full trimmed, coloured Swords, and Buckles.

And on Sunday the 5th of May the Court to go out of Mourning.
