To the Secret Committee of the Honorable Court of Direflors for the Affairs of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, London.

HONORABLE SIRS,

IN Addition to the Information communicated 1. in our last Overland Dispatch, on the Subject of the Events of the War with Jefwunt Row Holkar, we take this Occasion to report, that we have fince been advised of an Attack made by a Division of Holkar's Infantry and Artillery on the City of Delhi, on the 8th Illt. Lieutenant-Colonel Burn, the Officer in Command of the British Troops at that Sta+ tion, reporting that, during the Whole of that Day, the Enemy continued a very heavy Cannonade ; and that on the 9th they advanced and erected a Four Gun Battery, very near to the South East Bastion of the City Wall, where their Shot had great Ef-fect. To check their Progress in that Quarter a Sortie was determined on. The Party employed confilting of about Three Hundred and Fifty Men, under the Command of Lieutenant Role, of which Number Fifty, with a Six-Pounder, composed the Referve, under Lieutenant Dickfon. The Whole are stated to have been speedily and well conducted to the Enemy's Battery, and to have foon got Pof-feffion of their Guns, and fpiked them; the Party then returning under a heavy Difcharge of Shot and Grape, Lieutenant Rofe; who led the Detachment, and the Whole of the Officers, are reported to have executed that Duty to the entire Satisfaction of Lieutenant-Colonel Burn, who also mentions in favourable Terms Captain Carnagic and Lieutenant Woodville, of Captain Harriott's Battalion, and Lieutenants Evans, Heathcore, and Lockett, of the 2d Battalion 14th Regiment, befides fome others, whofe Names he adverts to as having been reported to the Commander in Chief in a former Difpatch, which has not reached us.

2. On the 14th the Enemy attempted an Affault on the Town of Delhi, but were repulfed with confiderable Lofs. The Details of the Affault ha confiderable Lofs. not been received up to the Date of our latest Advices from Calcutta, but in a Difpatch from the Commander in Chief to His Excellency the Covernor General, he thus adverts to the Spirit and Gallantry of the Troops at Delhi : " The merito-" rious Condust of our Troops, on both of the above-.. mentioned Occasions, reflects on their Courage " and Perfeverance the highest Credit. My Letter " from, Lieutenant-Colonel Auchterlony, the act "ing Refident, speaks in the higheft Terms of "the Conduct of the Troops under his Orders. " I beg to allure your Excellency that the Ar-"rangements made by that Officer merit my 66 warmelt Praife and Approbation; on which I shall have the Honor more fully to report hereafter."

Official. Advices had been received at Fort William, in a Letter from the Commander in Chief, dated Sierie, the 16th of October, flating that the Troops of Jefwunt Row Holkar had made a precipitate Retreat on the Morning of the 15th, from their Polition near the Town of Delhi.

4. Since taking Poffeffion of Chandore, Dhoorp, and Galna the Force employed in the Deckan, under the Command of Lieutenant Golonel Wallace, has been advancing towards the River Taptie. According to the latest Accounts from that Offi-

cer, a Party of the Pefhwa's Troops detached from Galna had obtained Poffelfion of the Town of Nunderbar, and of the greater Part of that Diffrict, without meeting with any Oppolition. As foon as the Pcfhwa's Officers fhould be in Poffeffion of the Tract weft of his Polition on the River Panja, and fouth of the Taptie, Lieutenant-Colonel Wallace intended to move to Borenair. Holkar's Retainer's in Candeifh appear now to be reduced to Two or Three inconfiderable Chiefs, with but few Followers.
