AT the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, the 23d Day of May 1805,

P R E S E N T,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-fourth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for establishing and maintaining a permanent Additional Force for the Defence of the Realm, and to provide for augmenting His Majesty's Regular Forces, and for the gradual Reduction of the Militia of England;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That from and after the passing of the said Act, there shall be raised in the several Counties in England, for the Year ending on the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, towards supplying the Vacancies that have arisen in such Additional Force by reason of the enlisting of any Persons serving therein into His Majesty's Regular Forces, a further and additional Number of Nine Thousand Men: And it is further enacted, That His Majesty's Privy Council shall cause such Number of Nine Thousand Men to be raised for the supplying the Vacancies which have arisen from the enlisting of Men as aforesaid, in the several Counties in England, to be apportioned among such Counties according to the respective original Quotas of Men required at the Time of making such Apportionment to be raised in such respective Counties under the Acts relating to the Militia; and shall, as soon after such Apportionment shall have been made as the same can be done, cause the Numbers fixed and settled by such Apportionment to be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the several Counties in England, or their Vice Lieutenants, and shall also cause Notice thereof to be given in the London Gazette; and such Lieutenants, or Vice Lieutenants, shall immediately summon General and Subdivision Meetings of Lieutenancy in their respective Counties; and the Deputy Lieutenants at such Meetings shall divide and ap-

portion the Number so fixed and settled among the Hundreds in their respective Counties, and among the several Parishes of such Hundreds, according to the Provisions of the several Acts relating to the Militia, in order that such Men may, as speedily as possible, be raised for the Additional Force, under the Provisions of the said Act, His Majesty's Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Directions contained in the said Act, are thereupon pleased to apportion and divide, and do hereby apportion and divide, over the several Counties in England, the Number of Men to serve for such Counties respectively, according to the several Numbers specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and amounting, in the Whole, to Eight Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-five Men; and which Schedule His Majesty's Privy Council are pleased to direct shall be taken as Part of this Order, and they do hereby direct that this Order, and the Schedule thereunto annexed, be published in the London Gazette, and be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the several Counties in England, or their Vice Lieutenants, in order that they should proceed upon the same in pursuance of the Directions of the said Act of Parliament.

" permanent Additional Force for the Defence of the Realm, and to provide for augmenting His Majesty's Regular Forces, and for the gradual Reduction of the Militia of Scotland," it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That, from and after the passing of the said Act, there shall be raised in the several Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, for the Year ending on the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and five, towards supplying the Vacancies that have arisen in such Additional Force, by reason of the enlisting of any Persons enrolled therein into His Majesty's Regular Forces, a further and additional Number of One Thousand Eight Hundred Men: And it is further enacted, That His Majesty's Privy Council shall cause such Number of One Thousand Eight Hundred Men, for the supplying the Vacancies arising from the enlisting of Men as aforesaid, to be apportioned among such Counties according to the respective original Quotas of Men required at the Time of making such Apportionment to be raised in such respective Counties and Stewartries under the Act relating to the Militia; and shall, as soon after such Apportionment shall have been made as the same can be done, cause the Numbers fixed and settled by such Apportionment to be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the several Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, or their Vice Lieutenants, and shall also cause Notice thereof to be given in the Edinburgh Gazette; and such Lieutenants or Vice Lieutenants shall immediately summon General and Subdivision Meetings of Lieutenancy in their respective Counties and Stewartries; and the Deputy Lieutenants at such Meetings shall divide and apportion the Numbers so fixed and settled among the Subdivisions, Parishes, Cities, or Places in their respective Counties and Stewartries, according to the Provisions of any Act relating to the Militia, in order that such Men may, as speedily as possible, be raised for the Additional Force under the Provisions of this Act, His Majesty's Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Directions contained in the said Act, are thereupon pleased to apportion and divide, and do hereby apportion and divide, over the several Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, the Number of Men to serve for such Counties respectively, according to the several Numbers specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, and amounting, in the Whole, to One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-two Men, and which Schedule His Majesty's Privy Council are pleased to direct shall be taken as Part of this Order; and they do hereby direct that this Order, and the Schedule thereunto annexed, be published in the Edinburgh Gazette, and be transmitted to the respective Lieutenants of the several Counties and Stewartries in Scotland, or their Vice Lieutenants, in order that they should proceed upon the same, in pursuance of the Directions of the said Act of Parliament.

A CHAPTER of the Most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned for this Day, the Knights Companions, in the full Habit of the Order, with the Officers of the Order hereafter-mentioned in their Mantles, and wearing their Chains

and Badges, having assembled in the King's Drawing-Room, repaired from thence in order to attend His Majesty in his private Apartment; and being there called over by Garter King of Arms, a Proceffion was made to the Chapter-Room in the following Order:

The SOVEREIGN.

The Sovereign and Knights Companions being seated, the Register, in the Absence of the Chancellor, signified to the Chapter the Sovereign's Pleasure for filling up the vacant Stall in St. George's Chapel at Windfor; and as, by the Statutes, none but a Knight can be elected, Garter was commanded to introduce the Earl of Dartmouth, Lord Chamberlain of His Majesty's Household, who was knighted by the Sovereign with the Sword of State, and thereupon withdrew.

His Majesty, assisted by the Two Senior Knights Companions, buckled it on the Earl's Left Leg, the Register pronouncing the Admonition.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the Election; and the Suffrages being collected by the Register, and presented to the Sovereign, George Earl of Dartmouth was, by His Majesty's Command, declared duly elected. His Lordship was thereupon received at the Door of the Chapter-Room by the Two Junior Knights Companions, and conducted between them to the Sovereign, preceded by Garter, bearing the Ensigns of the Order on a Cushion.

Garter then presented the Ribband with the George to the Sovereign; and, the Earl kneeling, the Sovereign, with the Assistance of the said Two Senior Knights Companions, put it over His Lordship's Shoulder, the Register, in the mean Time, pronouncing the Admonition, and His Lordship having kissed His Majesty's Hand, and saluted the Knights present, withdrew.

The Chapter ended, Garter called over the Knights, and a Proceffion was made back to His Majesty's Apartment in the Order as before.

The Queen, Their Royal Highnesses the Princesses, and many Ladies and other Persons of Distinction, were present.

DISPATCHES have been received Overland at the India-House from Bombay, dated the 21st of December 1804, enclosing a Copy of a Letter from Lord Lake to Marquis Wellesley, of the 17th of November, giving an Account of the Result of his Attack upon the Cavalry of Jeswunt Rao Holkar, commanded by that Chief in Person upon that Day, being the Letter which was referred to by Lord Lake in his subsequent Letter of the 18th of November, as published in the London Gazette Extraordinary of the 27th of April 1805, and which was noticed in that Gazette as not having then arrived in England.

To His Excellency the Most Noble Marquis Wellesley, Governor-General, &c. &c. &c.

M^y LORD,

I HAVE the Honor to inform your Lordship that, in pursuance of my Intentions, expressed in my Dispatch of Yesterday's Date, I reached this Place this Morning, with the Cavalry, before Day-break, after a March of upwards of Thirty-four Miles.

The Enemy occupied a Position close under the Walls of Ferruckabad, and I completely succeeded in surprising them. The Consequence has been, that vast Numbers of their Men and Horses have been destroyed, and the Whole Cattle and Baggage taken, which they possessed.

Jeswunt Rao Holkar escaped by an early Flight, but his Troops, in the greatest Confusion, were pursued, and every where cut to pieces by my Cavalry. I am happy to add, that we have sustained very little Loss, either in Men or Horses.

I have not Time, at the present Moment, to express the Satisfaction I have derived from the good Conduct of all the Corps engaged, but I shall have

the Honor of forwarding to your Lordship my Sentiments on this Subject as soon as possible.

"WE feel also much Pleasure in reporting the successful Progress of the Division of the Army in Malwa, under the Command of Colonel Murray, which, after completing the Conquest of Holkar's Possessions West of the Chumbiel, reached Muccondra on the 30th of November, and still continued to advance."

"On the 8th Instant* General Jones was at Jowra, one March beyond Rutlam, and would probably have joined Colonel Murray's Army by or before the present Date."
