fion of Parliament, an Act, made in the laft Seffion of Parliament, for appointing Commiffioners to enquire into the Fees, Gratuities, Perquilites, and Emoluments which are or have been lately received in the feveral Public Offices in Irelaud therein mentioned, to examine into any Abufes which may exift in the fame, and into the prefent Mode of receiving, collecting, iffuing, and accounting for Public Money in Irelaud.

An Act for the Encouragement of Seamen, and for the better and more effectually manning Eis Majefty's Navy during the prefent War.

An Act to prevent, in Great Britain, the illegally carrying away Bark; and for amending Two Acts, paifed in the Sixth and Ninth Years of His prefent Majefty's Reign, for the Prefervation of Timber, Trees, Underwoods, Roots, Shrubs, Plants, Hollies. Thorns, and Quickfets.

An Act to amend an Act, made in the Ninth Year of King George the Firft, for amending the Laws relating to the Settlement, Employment, and Relief of the Poor, fo far as the fame respects Contracts to be entered into for the Maintenance and Employment of the Poor.

An Act to empower the Juffices of the Place within the Division or Hundred of Salford, in the County-Palatine of Lancaiter, to raife a Sum of Money to be paid by way of Salary to the Chairman of the Quarter Seffions for the faid Hundred.
