

Blackwall aforesaid, shall take Effect, and be in full Force and Operation; and the said Term of Twenty-one Years, during which the aforesaid Provisions are to be in Force, shall commence at and be computed from the Expiration of Ten Days from the Time of the first Publication of the said Certificate as beforementioned; any Thing in the said recited Act contained to the contrary notwithstanding:

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of the Right Honorable Henry Addington, Nathaniel Bond, and John Hiley Addington, Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, granted on the Twenty-first Day of August, One thousand eight hundred and two, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, the said Lords Commissioners did certify and make known that the following Works, made and erected by the said West India Dock Company under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, (viz.) The Entrance Basin at the East End of the said Works, the Great Dock, Three Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, numbered 2, 4, and 8, and the Quays or Wharfs from the North Side of the Lock at the East Entrance of the said Dock, along the North Side of the same Dock, and terminating at the North Side of the Lock at the West Entrance of the said Dock:

And whereas by another Certificate under the Hands of the Right Honorable Henry Addington, Charles Small Pybus, and George Thynne, Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, granted on the Twenty-second Day of August, One thousand eight hundred and three, in pursuance of the said Act passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, the said last-mentioned Lords Commissioners did certify and make known that the following Works, made and erected by the said West India Dock Company under the Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, were so far completed, that, in their Judgment, the same were fit for the Reception of Ships and Goods respectively, (viz.) The Entrance Basin at the West End of the said Works; also Ten additional Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, that is to say, Three large Warehouses, numbered 3, 6, and 7; Three other large Warehouses, (viz.) One Warehouse adjoining the West End of the Warehouse No. 2, and called No. 1; the Second Warehouse covering the Space between the Warehouse No. 4, and No. 6, and called No. 5; and the Third Warehouse adjoining the West End of the Warehouse No. 8, and called No. 9; also Four other smaller Warehouses, the first covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 2, and No. 3; the Second covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 3, and No. 4; the Third covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 6 and No. 7; and the Fourth covering the Space between the Warehouses No. 7 and No. 8; and which said Ten Warehouses, together with the Three Warehouses comprised in the said former Certificate, formed the complete Range of Warehouses on the North Side of the said Dock, from the West End to the East End thereof, and likewise One other Warehouse at the East End of the said Dock:

We, the undersigned Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, do, in pursuance of the said Act

passed in the Forty-second Year of His present Majesty's Reign, further certify and make known, that the following Works, made and erected by the said West India Dock Company under Authority of the said Acts of Parliament, are so far completed, that, in our Judgment, the same are fit for the Reception of Goods, Wares, and Merchandize; (viz.) Two Warehouses on the South Side of the said Dock, and the Quays or Wharfs on the South Side of the Lock at the East Entrance of the said Dock, along the South Side of the same Dock, and terminating at the South Side of the Lock, at the West Entrance of the said Dock.

BY THE LORDS COMMISSIONERS OF
HIS MAJESTY'S TREASURY.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for permitting certain Goods imported into Great Britain to be secured in Warehouse without Payment of Duty," it is (amongst other Things) enacted as follows: "That it shall be lawful for the Importer or Importers, Proprietor or Proprietors, Consignee or Consignees of any of the Goods, Wares, or Merchandize enumerated or described in the Table hereunto annexed, marked (A), and which shall be legally imported and brought into the Port of London, to lodge and secure the same, under the Joint Locks of the Crown and the Merchant, in any Warehouse or Warehouses, situated at the Isle of Dogs, and belonging to the West India Dock Company, without Payment at the Time of the first Entry of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize of the Duties of Customs or Excise due on the Importation thereof, subject nevertheless to the Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions directed by this Act: Provided always, that no such Goods, Wares, or Merchandize shall be so lodged or secured, unless and until such Warehouses and other Works belonging to, or to belong thereto, shall be so far completed, that, in the Judgment of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, the same shall be fit and proper in every Respect, for the Reception of such Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and wherein the same may respectively be safely and securely deposited, and remain under the Regulations and Directions of this Act, and the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the Time being, or any Three or more of them, are hereby authorized and enjoined, by Writing under his or their Hand or Hands, to certify and make known his or their Approbation of such Warehouses, which Certificate shall be published Three Times at least, in the London Gazette, and in Two or more public Morning Newspapers then usually circulated in London:"

And whereas by a Certificate under the Hands of Three of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, bearing Date the Sixteenth Day of March, One thousand eight hundred and four, the said Lords Commissioners did, in pursuance of the said Act of Parliament, certify and make known,
