NORTHERN LIGHT-HOUSES.

Notice to Mariners, of a Revolving Light on the Island of Sandy in Orkney.

THE Beacon, or Tower of Masonry, erected in

1803, upon the Start Point of Sandy, situate in the County of Orkney, in North Lat. 59 Deg. 31 Min. and West Long. 2 Deg. 15 Min. not having been found to prevent the numerous Wrecks which happen upon the low Shores of that Island, has been converted into a Light-House, which will be lighted upon the Night of Wednesday the 1st Day of January, 1806, and thereafter each Night, from the Expiration of Day-light in the Evening, until Day-light in the Morning.
