of the heavy Lois which the Nation has fuftained in . the Death of the gallant, the intrepid Nelfon; one of the most eminent Naval Characters of this or, perhaps, any other Age. He died indeed, as be-came the Hero, in the Defence of his Country, in the Arms of Victory, amidst the Tears and Ap-plauses of his grateful and admiring Countrymen. The Lustre of his Name, and his bright Example, -will, we doubt not, infpire future Generations; and we truft there never will be wanting Britons, ready, like him, to fight their Country's Battles with equal - Skill and Ardour, and with equal Succefs.

We embrace this Opportunity of expressing our Duty and Attachment to your facred Perfon; and we most fervently pray, that, under the Protection of a gracious Providence, thefe great Events may lead to the general Repole of Europe, and that your Majefty may long continue to reign in the Hearts of a loyal and affectionate People.
