missioners of His Majesty's Treasury, pursuant to an Act of Parliament, to let to farm the Duties granted by "An Act of the Twenty-fifth of His present Majesty, on 'Horses let to Hire for travelling Post, and by Time.'" do hereby give Notice, that we intend to let, at our Office in Somerset-Place, the said Duties to farm, on Saturday the 21st of December next, between the Hours of Ten and Twelve in the Forenoon, according to the Districts in the Statement under-mentioned, for the Term of Three Years, from the 1st Day of February next, to such Persons as may be willing to contract for the same. All Persons intending to farm the said Duties are to deliver in their Proposals to us at the Stamp-Office in Somerset-Place, at least Three Days previous to the said 21st Day, of December next, signed with their Names, stating the Places of their Abode, and specifying the District for which they intend to bid, or their Proposals cannot be proceeded on, as directed by the said Act.

No Persons licensed to let Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any Persons for their Use, can be admitted to contract for the said Duties.
