able bodied Landmen not above the Age of Thirtyfive, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforesaid, thould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was also gracioully pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thousand eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every able and ordinary Seaman, fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships, should be paid to any Person who should discover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him, or themselves, so that such Seam in or Seamen should be taken for His Majetly's Service by any of His Majetty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men. on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Procla mation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty first Day of December Iast: And whereas His Majesty was graciously pleafed by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of November last, to promife and declare that all able bodied Landmen fo entering themselves to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, on or before the said Thirty sirst of December last should be entitled to receive the faid Bounty of Thirty Shillings each Man, upon Proof being exhibited that such able-bodied Landmen were not above the Age of Thirty-sive, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years; and that a Reward of Three Pounds for every able Seaman and Fifty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majefty's Ships should be paid in the Manner directed hy His Majesty's Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and five, to any Person who should discover fuch Seaman or Seamen respectively, who might conceal him or themselves, so that such Seaman or Seamen might be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed for raising Men on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December last: And whereas by the faid aboverecited Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh Day of November Iast, His Majesty was further pleased to promise and declare, that a Reward of Four Guineas for every able Seaman, Three Guineas for every ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every Landman should be paid to any Person or Persons who might, on or before the said Thirty-first Day of December last, inclusive. procure the voluntary Service of, and convey fuch able Seaman or Landman fit for His Majesty's Service; on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in railing Men, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each able Seaman, ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile they might respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or nearest Place of Refidence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men, (provided such Man should be fit for His Majesty's Service, and there should not be Reason to suppose, that he was an Apprentice,) the faid Rewards and travelling Allowance, to be paid in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation: And whereas the Time li-

and travelling Allowance, has expired; is expedient that the Payment thereof fince the Thirty-first of December last should be confirmed and approved, and that such Payment should be still further continued for some Time longer, His Majelty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards and travelling Allowance made fince the Thirty-fielt Day of December last, be confirmed, and approved; and that the like Payment be further made and continued from the Date hereof until the Thirty-first Day of December next inclusive, whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice and govern themselves accordingly. ## PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His prefented Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the " Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Co-" lonies and Plantations in North America, and in " the West India Islands, and the Countries belong: ing to the United States of America, and between "His Majelly's faid Subjects and the Foreign "His Majelly's faid Subjects and the Foreign "Islands in the West Indies;" it is, amongst other. Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be issued and published from Time to Time, to author rize, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorize, in Case of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland for the then enfuing Season only; provided always, that such Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Island of Newfoundland, shall not be imported, except in Conformity to such Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be specified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, respectively, and except by British Subjects, and in British built Ships, owned by His Majelly's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and necessary that Provision be made for fully supplying the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season, with Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, His Majelly doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fishermen of the Island of Newfoundland, for the ensuing Season only, Bread, Flour, Pease, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, may be imported into the faid Island from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from some Port mited for Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Inc.
