

able bodied Landmen not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Twenty Years, who should fo enter themselves as aforefaid, fhould receive the Sum of Thirty Shillings each Man, as His Majesty's Royal Bounty: And whereas His Majesty was alfo graciously pleafed, by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of March One thoufand eight hundred and three, to promife and declare, that a Reward of Twenty Shillings for every able and ordinary Seaman, fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships, fhould be paid to any Perfon who fhould difcover any Seaman or Seamen who might conceal him, or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen fhould be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men, on or before the Thirtieth Day of April then next: And whereas the Time limited by the faid Proclamation for Payment of the faid Bounties and Reward hath, by Order in Council, been prolonged and extended to the Thirty firft Day of December laft: And whereas His Majesty was graciously pleafed by His Royal Proclamation bearing Date the Seventh Day of November laft, to promife and declare, that all able bodied Landmen fo entering themfelves to ferve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, on or before the faid Thirty firft of December laft fhould be entitled to receive the faid Bounty of Thirty Shillings each Man, upon Proof being exhibited that fuch able-bodied Landmen were not above the Age of Thirty-five, nor under the Age of Eighteen Years; and that a Reward of Three Pounds for every able Seaman and Fifty Shillings for every ordinary Seaman fit to ferve on board His Majesty's Ships fhould be paid in the Manner directed by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Sixth Day of February One thoufand eight hundred and five, to any Perfon who fhould difcover fuch Seaman or Seamen refpectively, who might conceal him or themfelves, fo that fuch Seaman or Seamen might be taken for His Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed for raifing Men on or before the faid Thirty-firft Day of December laft: And whereas by the faid above-recited Proclamation, bearing Date the Seventh Day of November laft, His Majesty was further pleafed to promife and declare, that a Reward of Four Guineas for every able Seaman, Three Guineas for every ordinary Seaman, and Two Guineas and a Half for every Landman fhould be paid to any Perfon or Perfons who might, on or before the faid Thirty-firft Day of December laft, inclusive, procure the voluntary Service of, and convey fuch able Seaman or Landman fit for His Majesty's Service, on board any of His Majesty's Ships or Veffels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, together with an Allowance at the Rate of One Penny per Mile for each able Seaman, ordinary Seaman, and Landman, for every Mile they might refpectively travel to the neareft of His Majesty's Ships of War, or neareft Place of Residence of any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raifing Men, (provided fuch Man fhould be fit for His Majesty's Service, and there fhould not be Reason to fuppofe, that he was an Apprentice,) the faid Rewards and travelling Allowance, to be paid in the Manner directed by the faid Proclamation: And whereas the Time limited for Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards

and travelling Allowance, has expired; and it is expedient that the Payment thereof fhould be expedient that the Payment thereof fhould be confirmed and approved, and that fuch Payment fhould be ftill further continued for fome Time longer, His Majesty, with the Advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the Payment of the faid Bounties, Rewards and travelling Allowance made fince the Thirty-firft Day of December laft, be confirmed, and approved; and that the like Payment be further made and continued from the Date hereof until the Thirty-firft Day of December next inclusive, whereof all Perfons concerned are to take Notice and govern themfelves accordingly. *W. The KING's Moft Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, paffed in the Twenty-eighth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majesty, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in North America, and in the Weft India Iflands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His Majesty's faid Subjects and the Foreign Iflands in the Weft Indies;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it fhall and may be lawful for His Majesty in Council, by Order or Orders to be iffued and publifhed from Time to Time, to authorize, or by Warrant or Warrants under His Sign Manual, to empower the Governor of Newfoundland, for the Time being, to authorize, in Cafe of Necessity, the Importation into Newfoundland of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fifhermen of the Ifland of Newfoundland for the then enfuing Seafon only; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported into the Ifland of Newfoundland, fhall not be imported, except in Conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations, and Reftrictions as fhall be fpecified in fuch Order or Orders, Warrant or Warrants, refpectively, and except by Britifh Subjects, and in Britifh-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law: And whereas it is expedient and neceffary that Provision be made for fully fupplying the Inhabitants and Fifhermen of the Ifland of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon, with Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, that, for the Supply of the Inhabitants and Fifhermen of the Ifland of Newfoundland, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour, Peafe, Indian Corn, Butter, and Live Stock, may be imported into the faid Ifland from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by Britifh Subjects, and in Britifh-built Ships, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which, within the Space of Nine Months previous to the Time of fuch Importation, have cleared out from fome Port of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ire-
