The humble Address of the Electors of the an-
cient Town and Borough of Southwark, in
Town-Hall assembled, the 18th Day of Fe-
bruary, 1806.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Sub-
jects, the Electors of Southwark, deeply im-
pressed with the Sense of your Majesty's Goodness,
and parental Regard for the Happiness of your
People, beg Leave, most thankfully, to acknowlege
the late striking Instance of it in your Majesty's Ap-
pointment of a firm, efficient, and extended Admi-
nistration, for the Management of the public Affairs
at this very critical Period, whose Measures, we rely
with Confidence, will be governed by the true Prin-
ciples of the Constitution, and whose Exertions, we
humbly trust, under the Blessing of Divine Provi-
dence, may yet be equal to the arduous Task of
extricating the Nation from the Difficulties that
surround us, and, finally, add Lustre to your Ma-
