HAVE the Honor to transmit, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the inclosed Copy of a Letter from Captain Paget; and have great Pleasure in expressing my Admiration of the gallant Exploit therein recorded. ST. VINCENT. I am, &c.

Egyptienne, off Cape Finisherre,
My Lord, 9th March, 1806.

HAVE the Honor to inform your Lordship,
that having received Intelligence of a large French Privateer being in the Harbour of Muros, I decided on feizing the first Opportunity of gaining Possessing of her; I accordingly anchored His Majesty's Ship under my Command off that Port last Night, and immediately sent the Boats away to endeavour to cut her out, in which, I am happy to acquaint your Lordship, they succeeded, though she was moored close to the Beach, and under the Pro-rection of Two Batteries, which kept up an incessant Fire, till the was towed clear of their range.

This Vessel which appears to be perfectly adapted for His Majesty's Service, proves to be L'Alcide of Bourdeaux, a Frigate-built Ship, pierced for Thirty sour Guus, only Two Years old, and had, when last at Sea, a Complement of Two Hundred and Forty Men. This Assair, so honorable to those who atchieved it, was conducted by Captain Hand-field, who was ably supported by Lieutenants Alelevn and Garthwaite, of the Marines, the Petty

Officers and Boats' Crews.

To account for that enterprizing zealous Officer, Captain Handfield, beingein the Egyptienne, I have to inform your Lordship, that not having received an official Communication of his Promotion previous to cur failing, he volunteered, remaining in the Ship as First Lieutenant during the Cruise.

An Act for fettling and fecuring certain Annuities on Cuthbert Lord Collingwood, and the feveral other Persons therein described, in Consideration of the fignal and important Service performed by the faid Cuthbert Lord Collingwood to His Majesty

and the Public.

An Act to continue several Acts for granting certain Rates and Duties, and allowing certain Draw-backs and Bounties, on Goods, Wares, and Merchandize imported into and exported from Ireland; and for granting a Duty upon Malt and Spirits made and distilled in Ireland, until the 29th Day of September 1806; and for granting certain Inland Duties of Excise and Taxes in Ireland, until the 25th Day of March 1807.

An Act to continue until the 25th Day of March 1807, and to amend several Acts for regulating the Drawbacks and Bounties on the Exportation of

Sugar from Treland.

An Act for allowing the Exportation of Corn

and other Articles for the Use of His Majesty's Forces and Garrisons.

An Act to indemnify such Persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for Offices and Employments, and for extending the Times limited for those Purposes respectively, until the 25th Day of December 1806; and to permit such Persons in Great Britain, as have omitted to make and file Affidavits of the Execution of Indentures of Clerks to Attornies and Solicitors, to make and file the same on or before the first Day of Michaelmas Term 1806.
