**T**HE Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having given Directions for paying off the Principal of the above mentioned Exchequer Bills with the Interest thereon, at the Exchequer Bill-Office, in the Receipt of Exchequer, New Palace-Yard, Westminster, on Wednesday the 30<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1806, Attendance will be given daily (Sundays and Holidays excepted) until Thursday the 24<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1806, inclusive, from Ten o'Clock in the Morning till One in the Afternoon, for the Purpose of receiving the same. And for the greater Dispatch, the Bearers of the said Bills are desired to bring Lists thereof, containing the Numbers in Numerical Order, according to the Value of the said Bills, and Times of Commencement of Interest, with the Principal Sums and Interest due thereon, computed from the Days on which they are respectively dated, exclusive, to the said 30<sup>th</sup> Day of April 1806, inclusive, when the Interest will cease; and they are desired to write their Names and Places of Abode on such Lists, and indorse their Names on the said Bills.

Royal College of Physicians, March 31, 1806.

**T**HE Censors of the Royal College of Physicians appointed for the present Year are about to commence their Annual Visitation of the Shops of the Apothecaries, Druggists, and Chymists within their Jurisdiction.

They are fully sensible of the Importance of the Duty to be performed by them, and are determined (as far as in their Power,) to correct the several Abuses so much complained of by their Predecessors in Office.

Their Attention will be chiefly directed to the following Objects:

1<sup>st</sup>, That the Scales, Weights, Measures, and other Utensils of the Shops be perfect and complete, and that they be of such Materials as are recommended by the College.

2<sup>d</sup>ly, That a Copy of the Latin Edition of the London Pharmacopœia be in each Shop, and that the new Nomenclature be in general Use.

3<sup>d</sup>ly, That their Drugs, both simple and compounded be of sufficient Variety, of good Quality, and in a proper State of Preservation.

4<sup>th</sup>ly, That in the Absence of the Master, the Shop be under the Care of a Person or Persons well informed in the compounding of Medicines, and who can read the Pharmacopœia, and the Prescriptions of Physicians.

The Censors are likewise determined to give a proper Degree of Publicity to their Reports, that such Shops as are approved of be distinguished from those that are defective either from bad Drugs, or from ignorant and negligent Management.

They think proper to give this previous Notice to Apothecaries, Druggists, and Chymists, that they may have
