feveral Courts of Admiralty within His Ma-jelty's Dominions, to take Cognizance of, and proceed upon all and all Manner of Captures, Sei zures, Prizes, and Reprifals of all Ships and Goods that are, or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the Court of Admiralty and the Laws of Nations to adjudge and condemn all fuch Ships, Vessels, and Goods as shall belong to Prussia, or the Vassals and Subjects of the King of Prussia, or to any others inhabiting within any of His Countries, Territories, and Dominions, or as shall belong to the Town of Papenburgh, (except as aforefaid); and that such Powers and Clauses be inserted in the said Commission as have been usual, and are according to former Precedents; and they are likewise to prepare and lay before His Majesty at this Board, a Draft of fuch Instructions as may be proper to be sent to the Courts of Admiralty in His Majesty's Foreign Gowernments and Plantations for their Guidance herein; as also another Draft of Instructions for such, Ships as shall be commissionated for the Purposes abovementioned.

An Act for raifing a certain Sum of Money by way of Annuities or Debentures, for the Service of Treland.

An Act for railing the Sum of Five Hundred Thousand Pounds by Treasury Bills for the Service of Ireland, for the Year One thousand eight hundred and fix.

An Act for increasing the Salaries of the Judge of the Court of Admiralty in Scotland, and of the

Judges of the Commissary Court in Edinburgh.
An Act for extending the Annuity granted to Earl of St Vincent to the Two next Persons to whom the Title of Viscount St. Vincent is limited.

An Act for continuing an Act made in this Selsion of Parliament, intituled An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters within the United Kingdom, and the Islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man.

An Act to repeal several Acts passed in the Forty-third and Forty-fourth Years respectively of establishing an Additional Force for the Defence of the Realm.

An, Act to prevent the Importation of Slaves by any of His Majesty's Subjects into any Islands, Colonies, Plantations, or Territories belonging to any foreign Sovereign, State, or Power; and also to render more effectual a certain Order made by His Majesty in Council, on the Fisteenth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and five, for prohibiting the Importation of Slaves (except in certain Cases,) into any of the Settlements, Islands, Colonies, or Plantations on the Continent of America, or in the West Indies, which have been furrendered to His Majesty's Arms during the present War; and to prevent the fitting out of foreign Slave Shins from British Ports.
