THE following Address having been transmitted to the Right Honorable Earl Spencer, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, has been by his Lordship presented to the King; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty:

*May it please your Majesty,*

WE, your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful Subjects, the Catholics of the Town and County of Sligo, humbly approach your Majesty with Hearts warmed with the most lively Affection, and impressed with the deepest Veneration. Indelibly graven on our Memories are the numberless Obligations we owe to the best of Kings; it shall never be effaced from our Recollection, that, Aliens in our native Land, what we possess of Rank and Property has directly emanated from your royal and paternal Recommendation.
