- The Licences iffued between the 5th July and 5th August, are to bear Date on 'the 6th July; and fuch as are granted at any other Time, are to be dated the Day on which the fame shall be iffued, and they are respectively to continue in force until the enfuing 5th July.
- Perfons duly licenfed AS AUCTIONEERS are not required to take out Licences as Appraifers.
- Every Appraifer is to write or fet down, in Words or Figures, the full Amount of every Valuation or Appraifement, and, WITHIN FOURTEEN DAYS, to deliver the fame to his Employer, on Paper, &c.
