IS Majesty, taking into Confideration the Reprefentations that have been made on Behalf of the Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburgh, is pleafed, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Veffels under the Fapenburgh Flag, which were deflined to, and had arrived in, any of the Ports of the United Kingdom before the Fourteenth Day of May last, being the Day on which the Order for granting General Reprifals against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the Town of Papenburgh was iffued, or which were detained at Sea before the lame Period, not trading between Port and Port in Hoftility with His Majelly, thall be reflored, to gether with their Freight and Cargnes, upon Proof being made to the Satisfaction of the Court of Ad. miralty, that fuch Veffels, and any Goods laden on board the fame, do really belong to Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburgh, or other Subjects of the Duke of Arenberg; and that fuch Ships, with their Crews, and the faid Goods, be permitted to proceed to any Port not blockaded. And the Right Honourable the Lords Committioners of His Majefty's Treafury, the Lords Commiffioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports,

to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may refpectively appertain. W. Farwkener.

Westminster, June 21, 1806. An Act, for granting to His Majefly certain Duties upon Malt and Spirits made in Ireland.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for making better Provision for Soldiers. An Act to continue until the 24th Day of June 1807, and amend an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, for appointing Commiffioners to enquire and examine into any Irregularities and Abufes which might have taken place in conducting and managing the paving, cleanfing, and lighting the Streets of Dublin.

An Act for making and maintaining a Navigable, Canal from the Harbour of Ardroffan, in the County of Ayr, to Tradeflown, near Glafgow, in the County of Lanark, and a Collateral Cut from the faid Canal to the Coal Works at Hurlet, in the County of Renfrew.
