P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day the Right Honorable Alexander Marquis of Douglas and Clydesdale, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

AT the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 18th of June 1806,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty, taking into Consideration the Representations that have been made on Behalf of the Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburg, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Vessels under the Papenburg Flag, which were destined to, and had arrived in, any of the Ports of the United Kingdom before the Fourteenth Day of May last, being the Day on which the Order for granting General Reprisals against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the Town of Papenburg was issued, or which were detained at Sea before the same Period, not trading between Port and Port in Hostility with His Majesty, shall be restored, together with their Freight and Cargoes, upon Proof being made to the Satisfaction of the Court of Admiralty, that such Vessels, and any Goods laden on board the same, do really belong to Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburg, or other Subjects of the Duke of Arenberg; and that such Ships, with their Crews, and the said Goods, be permitted to proceed to any Port not blockaded, And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports,

and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. *W. Faulkner.*

THIS Day, the Lords being met, a Message was sent to the Honorable House of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorized by virtue of His Majesty's Commission for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honorable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly; and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for granting to His Majesty certain Duties upon Malt and Spirits made in Ireland.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Desertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for making better Provision for Soldiers.

An Act to continue until the 24th Day of June 1807, and amend an Act made in the last Session of Parliament, for appointing Commissioners to enquire and examine into any Irregularities and Abuses which might have taken place in conducting and managing the paving, cleansing, and lighting the Streets of Dublin.

An Act for making and maintaining a Navigable Canal from the Harbour of Ardrossan, in the County of Ayr, to Tradestown, near Glasgow, in the County of Lanark, and a Collateral Cut from the said Canal to the Coal Works at Hurlet, in the County of Renfrew.

An Act to alter, explain, amend, and enlarge the Powers of an Act passed in the Tenth Year of His late Majesty to enable the Proprietors and Inhabitants of the Houses in Red Lion-Square, in the County of Middlesex, to make a Rate on themselves for raising Money sufficient to inclose, pave, watch, clean, and adorn the said Square.
