T the Court at the Queen's Palace, the 18th of June 1806,

PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. IS Majesty, taking into Consideration the Representations that have been made on Behalf of the Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburgh, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Vessels under the Papenburgh Flag, which were destined to, and had arrived in, any of the Ports of the United Kingdom before the Fourteenth Day of May last, being the Day on which the Order for granting General Reprisals against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the Town of Papenburgh was issued, or which were detained at Sea before the fame Period, not trading between Port and Port in Hostility with His Majesty, shall be restored, together with their Freight and Cargoes, upon Proof being made to the Satisfaction of the Court of Admiralty, that such Vessels, and any Goods laden on board the same, do really belong to Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburgh, or other Subjects of the Duke of Arenberg; and that fuch Ships, with their Crews, and the said Goods, be permitted to proceed to any Port not blockaded. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord-Warden of the Cinque Ports, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions. herein, as to them may respectively appertain. THEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to authorize His Majesty, until the Twenty-fifth Day of March One thousand eight hundred and feven, to make Regulations respecting the Trade " and Commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope;" it is enacted, That it shall and may be His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders to be issued from Time to Time, to give such Directions. and make such Regulations, touching the Trade and Commerce to and from the Settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Territories and Dependencies thereof, as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and falutary; any of the Acts of Patliament therein referred to, or any Ufage,

Law, or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

And whereas during the Time the said Settlement, with the Territories and Dependencies thereof, were in the Possession, and under the Government, of the States General of the United Provinces, or of the Honorable the General East India Company in the Netherlands, it was usual to admit the Ships and Veffels belonging to the Subjects of Countries in-Amity with the faid United Provinces, into the Ports of the faid Settlement, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, for Repair and Refreshment; and with that View, to permit the faid Ships and Vessels to carry on Trade with the Inhabitants of the said Settlement, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, His Majesty is hereby pleased to order, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the Powers velted in His Majesty by the above-recited Act, and it is hereby ordered, That it shall be lawful. until further Order, for all Ships and Veffels belonging to His Majesty's Subjects, as well as for all Ships and Veffels belonging to the Subjects of any Country or State in Amity with His Majesty, to enter into the Ports of the said Settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, and to carry on Trade and Traffic with the Inhabitants of the said Settlement, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, and to import and export to and f on the Ports of the said Settlement, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, any Goods, Wares, or Merchandize whatfoever, subject to the following Exceptions, and subject also to such Duties, Rules, Regulations, and Restrictions as shall be established by His Majesty, or by the Governor of the said Settlement, and of the Territories and De-pendencies thereof, by virtue of Authority derived from His Majelty; and, in the mean Time, subject to fuch Duties, Kules, Regulations, and Restrictions as subfished, and were in force, before and at the lawful for His Majesty, by and with the Advice of I Time of the Conquest of the said Settlement by the
