**A**T the Court at the *Queen's Palace*, the 25th of June 1806,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by the Second Section of His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, certain Stations for the Performance of Quarantine by certain Ships and Vessels in the said Order specified, furnished with Clean Bills of Health, are assigned to such Ships and Vessels according to the Ports to which they are respectively bound; and Doubts have arisen at what Stations Quarantine ought to be performed by Ships and Vessels with Clean Bills of Health, captured or detained and brought into the Ports of Great Britain as Prize: His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare and order, that all such Ships and Vessels shall, for the Purpose of performing Quarantine, be deemed, and taken to be bound to the Ports into which they have been, or shall be so brought, and shall, together with all Persons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles on board thereof, perform Quarantine accordingly: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

**H**IS Majesty, taking into Consideration the Representations that have been made on Behalf

of the Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburg, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That all Vessels under the Papenburg Flag, which were destined to, and had arrived in, any of the Ports of the United Kingdom before the Fourteenth Day of May last, being the Day on which the Order for granting General Reprisals against the Ships, Goods, and Subjects of the Town of Papenburg was issued, or which were detained at Sea before the same Period, not trading between Port and Port in Hostility with His Majesty, shall be restored, together with their Freight and Cargoes, upon Proof being made to the Satisfaction of the Court of Admiralty, that such Vessels, and any Goods laden on board the same, do really belong to Inhabitants of the Town of Papenburg, or other Subjects of the Duke of Arenberg; and that such Ships, with their Crews, and the said Goods, be permitted to proceed to any Port not blockaded. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

*Extract of a Letter from Sir G. H. Barlow, to the Secret Committee of the Court of Directors, dated on the River Culna, 2d February 1806.*

**I** HAVE great Satisfaction in apprising your Honorable Committee, that, on the 22d December, a ratified Copy of the Treaty concluded between the Right Honorable Lord Lake and the accredited Vakeel of Dowlut Rao Scindiah, (a Copy of which was inclosed in my Dispatch to your Honorable Committee of the 4th of that Month,) was received by his Lordship, with a slight and unobjectionable Alteration in the Sixth Article, namely, the Omission of the Renunciation of that Chief's Claims to Tonk Rampoorah and Ba-
