HIS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, that, in pursuance of an Act of the present Session of Parliament, the following STAMP DUTIES UPON APPRAISEMENTS commence on the 6th of July next:

Upon every Piece of Paper, &c. on which the aggregate Amount of any Valuation or Appraisement of any Estate, Property, or Effects, Real or Personal, or of any Interest in Possession or Reversion, Remainder or Contingency, in any Estate or Property, Real or Personal, shall be written or set down, where the Amount shall not exceed 50l. 0 2 6

And where the Amount shall exceed 50l. and not exceed 100l. 0 5 0

And where the Amount shall exceed 100l. and not exceed 200l. 0 10 0

And where the Amount shall exceed 200l. and not exceed 500l. 0 15 0

And where the Amount shall exceed 500l. 1 0 0

And upon every Licence for an Appraiser 0 6 0

N. B. All Persons, valuing Property for or in Expectation of HIRE OR REWARD, are to be deemed Appraisers, and are to take out Annual Licences, upon pain of forfeiting for every Offence the Sum of 50 0 0

The Licences issued between the 5th July and 5th August, are to bear Date on the 6th July; and such as are granted at any other Time, are to be dated the Day on which the same shall be issued, and they are respec-

tively to continue in force until the ensuing 5th July.

Persons duly licensed AS AUCTIONEERS are not required to take out Licences as Appraisers.

Every Appraiser is to write or set down, in Words or Figures, the full Amount of every Valuation or Appraisement, and, WITHIN FOURTEEN DAYS, to deliver the same to his Employer, on Paper, &c. DULY STAMPED, on pain of forfeiting for every Neglect, or for delivering the same not duly stamped, the Sum of 50 0 0

No Person, who shall employ an Appraiser to make any Appraisement, is to receive or pay, or make any Compensation for making of such Appraisement, unless the same shall be written on Paper, &c. duly stamped, on pain of forfeiting for every Offence the Sum of 20 0 0

No other Part of an Appraisement is required to be stamped, except the Piece of Paper, &c. whereon the AGGREGATE AMOUNT of the Articles contained therein shall be written or set down.

The Commissioners give further Notice, that all Persons, who are required to take out Licences as Appraisers, and to provide themselves with Appraisement Stamps, may, after the 25th Instant, apply for the same at the Head-Office, in Somerset-Place, or to the Distributers in the different Counties.

DUTY ON PROPERTY. 1806.

Office for Taxes, June 17, 1806.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament for granting further Additional Rates and Duties on Profits arising from Property, Professions, &c. it is enacted, "That every Person (other than the Governor and Company of the Bank of England,) intrusted with the Payment of Annuities, or any Dividends, or Shares of Annuities payable out of the Public Revenue of Ireland, or of any Colony or Settlement belonging to the Crown of the United Kingdom to any Person or Persons, Corporations or Companies in Great Britain, or acting therein as Agent, or in any other Character therein described, shall, without further Notice or Demand thereof, deliver, or cause to be delivered into the Office for Taxes, at Somerset-House, Middlesex, an Account in Writing, containing their Names and Residence, and a Description of the Annuities, Dividends, and Shares entrusted to them for Payment, within One Calendar Month after the same shall have been required by public Notice in the London Gazette," in order that an Assessment may be made thereon, at the Rate prescribed by the Act. His Majesty's Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes do hereby give Notice to all Persons entrusted with the Payment of any Annuities, Dividends, or Shares of Annuities as above stated, that the Accounts of the said Annuities required by the Act, are to be delivered in Writing, into the Office for Taxes, at Somerset-House, addressed to the Secretary to the Commissioners for the Affairs of Taxes, within the Space
