

selves Physicians, who exercise the Profession of Physic without Authority, and in many Instances without due Qualification, feel it their Duty to apprise the Public of the legal Provisions to obviate this Evil, and to refer them to the List annually printed by the College, (which in future they will take Care to have properly circulated,) in order that the Names of all those may be known who, having been examined by the College according to Law, have been deemed competent to practise as Physicians.

Extract from the Acts of Parliament 14th and 15th of Hen. VIII.:

“ That it may be enacted in this present Parliament, that no Person from henceforth be suffered to exercise or practise in Physic through England, untill such Time that he be examined at London by the said President and Three of the said Elects, and have from the said President and Elects Letters testimonial of their approving and Examination, except he be a Graduate of Oxford or Cambridge, which hath accomplished all Things for his Form, without any Grace.”
