P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council of the Twentieth Day of January last, prohibiting the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eleventh Day of July next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's Service, and the Safety of this Kingdom, that the said Prohibition should be continued for some Time longer, His Majesty doth therefore, with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Person or Persons whosoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months, from the said Eleventh Day of July next, presume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, or do ship or lade any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rosin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Masts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Oker, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Vessel, in order to transporting the same into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permission first being had and obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act passed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to enable His Majesty to restrain the Exportation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation or Order in Council." But it is nevertheless His Majesty's Pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Com-

missioners of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Vessel from taking or having on board such Quantities of Naval Stores as may be necessary for the Use of such Ship or Vessel during the Course of her intended Voyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commissioners of the Admiralty for the Time being; nor to the Exportation of the said several Articles to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards or Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies: Provided that upon the Exportation of any of the said Articles for the Purposes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majesty's Yards and Garrisons, or to His Majesty's Colonies and Plantations in America or the West Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majesty's Forts and Settlements on the Coast of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of such Articles do first make Oath of the true Destination of the same to the Places for which they shall be entered outwards, before the Entry of the same shall be made, and do give full and sufficient Security, by Bond, to the Satisfaction of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, to carry the said Articles to the Places for which they are so entered outwards, and for the Purposes specified, and none other; and such Bond shall not be cancelled or delivered up until Proof be made to the Satisfaction of the said Commissioners, by the Production, within a Time to be fixed by the said Commissioners, and specified in the Bond, of a Certificate or Certificates, in such Form and Manner as shall be directed by the said Commissioners, shewing that the said Articles have been all duly landed at the Places for which they were entered outwards: And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, and the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

WHEREAS by the Second Section of His Majesty's Order in Council of the Fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and five, certain Stations for the Performance of Quarantine by certain Ships and Vessels in the said Order specified, furnished with Clean Bills of Health, are assigned to such Ships and Vessels according to the Ports to which they are respectively bound; and Doubts have arisen at what Stations Quarantine ought to be performed by Ships and Vessels with Clean Bills of Health, captured or detained and brought into the Ports of Great Britain as Prize: His Majesty is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to declare and order, that all such Ships and Vessels shall, for the Purpose of performing Quarantine, be deemed, and taken to be bound to the Ports into which they have been, or shall be so brought, and shall, together with all Persons, Goods, Wares, and Merchandize, and other Articles on board thereof, perform Quarantine accordingly: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the Rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the Time being of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

MY LORD,

THE Weather being hazy, we did not see the *Minerva* when the Princess Royal parted Company this Morning. As we stood in Shore the *Minerva* joined; and Captain Collier sent me a Letter, of which the inclosed is a Copy. It displays an enterprising Spirit on the Part of his Officers and Men employed upon this Service.

Minerva off Cape Finisterre,

June 23, 1806.

S I R,

THE particular Part of your Orders having been accomplished, by my falling in with His Majesty's Ships *Renown* and *Warrior* on the 21st Instant, I felt it my Duty to direct my Attention to the Annoyance of the Enemy's Trade carried on along this Coast to the Ports of Ferrol and Vigo, and having Reason to believe there were some *Lugger Privateers* in *Finisterre Bay*, under the Protection of the Fort, I last Night, it being calm, dispatched Two Boats from His Majesty's Ship under my Command to scour the Bay.

From among the Volunteers for this Service, it fell to the Lot of Lieutenant *Mulcafter*, First Lieutenant, accompanied by Lieutenant *Menzies* of the Royal Marines, to command the Cutter;—the Barge was directed by Lieutenant *Ogle Moore*.

This Forenoon I had the Satisfaction to see the Boats returning, accompanied by Five Spanish *Luggers* and *Chasse Marées*, as per Margin*, mostly laden with Wine, bound to Ferrol and Corunna. Lieutenant *Mulcafter* speaks very handiromely of the Support he received from the Officers and Petty Seamen and Marines employed on this Affair.

I feel I should be deficient in my Duty did I omit to state the Circumstances attending the Execution of this Service, so creditable to Lieutenant *Mulcafter* and his Companions.

The first Object was the Fort, mounting Eight Brass Guns, of Twenty four and Twelve Pounds, which commanded the Vessels. This was carried in a most neat and masterly Manner by the Bayonet and Pike, before the Guard had either Time to raise the Drawbridge, or discharge a Twelve-Pounder, which had been brought to face the Gate, (a Fishing Boat having apprized them of the Approach of our Boats,) Part of the Spanish Guard laid down their Arms, and are now on board; the rest escaped.

As the Day began to dawn, and as the Men were much harrassed from a long row to the Shore, and a fatiguing March over a heavy Sand, the Party were obliged to confine themselves to spiking the Guns, and throwing some of them into the Sea, e'er they took Possession of the Vessels.

The Circumstance from which I derive most Pleasure is, that this Service was executed without a Man being hurt on either Side, although the Boats in

their Return. during a Calm of near Three Hours, were exposed to the Fire of a Two Gun Battery from a Hill to the Southward of the Town.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that on Tuesday Evening the 24th Instant, about Five o'Clock, the Reverend George Parker, Rector of Oddingley, in the County of Worcester, was most cruelly murdered in a Field, within the Parish of Oddingley, and within a short Distance of his own Dwelling-House, by receiving a Shot from a Gun, which entered the Right Side of his Body near the short Rib, his Skull fractured, and his Head otherwise very much beaten with the Butt-end of such Gun; And whereas it hath been further represented to the King, that Richard Heming, late of the Borough of Droitwich, but heretofore of the Chapelry of Norton, near Bredon, in the same County, Carpenter and Wheelwright, stands suspected as being the Perpetrator of such cruel and inhuman Murder. The said Richard Heming is about Five Feet Five or Six Inches high, tight made, large Features, a large bald or high Forehead, dark Brown Hair, inclined to curl, black Beard, round Face, rather a wide Mouth, sharp Nose, dark Hazel Eyes, ruddy Complexion, had on at the Time when pursued, immediately after committing this diabolical Act, a dark Blue Coat with White Metal Buttons, which appeared too long for him, and a round old fashioned Hat with low Crown. The Evening after the Murder was committed the said Richard Heming was seen at Tiberton, Warrdon New Town, and Whittington, and is supposed to have with him Two Coats, the one long Blue Coat with White Metal Buttons, and the other a tight Brown Coat;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the atrocious Murder above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any One of them (except the Person who actually committed the said Murder,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of FIFTY GUINEAS is hereby offered to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, (except as is before excepted,) to be paid on the Conviction of any One or more of the Offenders by applying to the Magistrates of the said County of Worcester.

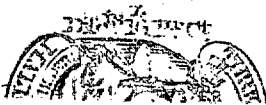
