Witbeck, July 16, 1806.

Whereas William Kirten, late of Witbeck Saint Peter's, in the said Isle of Ely, Wheelwright, did, in the Month of March, in the Year 1795, enlist into the Louth Royal Volunteer Corps, at Witbeck aforesaid, and then marched to join the said Corps at Louth, in the County of Lincoln, and from thence to Chatham for Inspection, and it is supposed he soon afterwards embarked with the Troops under the Command of Admiral Christian for the East or West Indies, and hath not since written to, or been heard of by his Friends; Notice is hereby given, that if the said William Kirten will apply to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of Witbeck Saint Peter's aforesaid, he will hear of something greatly to his Advantage; and in case of the Death of the said William Kirten, any Person who will send a regular Register of his Burial properly certified, to the said Churchwardens and Overseers, will be rewarded with Five Guineas.

The said William Kirten is about Fifty Years of Age, Five Feet Eight Inches high, with dark brown hair, large light Eyes, brown Complexion, and round Face, and had a sore Leg.

THE Royal College of Physicians, in London, having received Accounts from various Parts of England, complaining of the number of irregular Practitioners, calling themselves Physicians, who exercise the Profession of Physic with-

out Authority, and in many Instances without due Qualification, feel it their Duty to apprise the Public of the legal Provisions to obviate this Evil, and to refer them to the List annually printed by the College, (which in future they will take Care to have properly circulated,) in order that the Names of all those may be known who, having been examined by the College according to Law, have been deemed competent to practise as Physicians.

Extract from the Acts of Parliament 14th and 15th of Hen. VIII.:

"That it may be enacted in this present Parliament, that no Person from henceforth be suffered to exercise or practise in Physic through England, until such Time that he be examined at London by the said President and Three of the said Elects, and have from the said President and Elects Letters testimonial of their approving and Examination, except he be a Graduate of Oxford or Cambridge, which hath accomplished all Things for his Form, without any Grace."
