Rome, Feb. 8. N Monday last the Cardinal d' Estree had Audience of the Pope, with whom he was some hours; the next day the Pope sent him a Present of Wine and Fruits, as is customary. Most of the Cardinals and the Ambassadors of Spain, Porrugal U.s. have been to visit his Eminence, who his fent two Expresses to Paris since his arrival. On Tuesday last was Enterred with great Solemnity the Cardinal Nittard, he has left to the King and Queen, and Queen Mother, of Spain a Gross very richly set with Diamonds to each of them.

Vienna, Feb. 16. The Count of Starenberg and the Baron Herwarth who were appointed by the Emperorto meet and Treat with some of the chief of the Clergy and Nobility of Hungary for the Regulating of matters in order to the meeting of the Dyet, have had the good fuccess to determine things to the satisfaction of all parties; the Deputies of the Malecontents, who at nirst insided very earnessly that satisfaction might be at present given them upon some Points, having been content to refer them to the Determination of the Dyet, which will be how forthwith called; And having thus execut d their Commission, the Count of Starenberg is come back hither, and the Baron Herwart is gone to Linez to accquient the Emperor with what they have done. We are informed that the Imperial Minister in Poland, has orders to propose to the Dyet, which is now Assembled at Warlaw, a Defensive Alliance between his Imperial Majelly and that Crown, which we cannot think but they will readily close with, confidering the great jealousie they se m to have of the preparations which are in so extraordinary a manner making by the Turks; Which many think we in these parts ought likewise not to be uncon-

Lintz, Feb. 18. The 12th Instant arrived here the Baron Herwarth from Presbourg, to give the Emperor an Account of what had passed in the Conferences the Count of Starenberg and himself had had with the Hungarians, for the adjusting several preliminary matters concerning the Dyet, which the Emperor is refolved shall meet; we do not know the particulars of what has been done in the faid Conferences, but in the general we are told, that his Imperial Majelly is well pleased with it, and that Orders are given to dispatch the Circulary Letters for the Convoquing the faid Dyct at Ocdenburg. The third of the next Month the Emperor will part from hence for Old Octingen in Bavaria, from wherce he purpoles to return on the r3, and on the 23 of the same Month to remove from hence to Vienna are told that the Emperor has received an Account form his Minister at Constantinople. That he had prolonged the Peace that is now between his Imperial

Majesty and the Grand Sign or for 20 years; The new Leavies goe on however, and it is said at Court, that the Emperor has resolved to raise 20000 Mcff besides those that Commissions are already given

Ratubonne, Feb. 21. The Answer to the late Letter which the Dyet received from the French King having been read and allowed of in the feveral Colledges, the same has been put in to the hands of the Bilhop of Aichstadt the Imperial Commission -. er, in order to it's having the Emperors approbation before it be fent away. It is generally believed that the Emperors journey to Oestingen where the Elector of Bavaria is to meet him, will produce an Alliance between them, or that at least a great Progress will be made towards it, which we have the more reason to think, for that we know, the French have for some time been labouring to bring that Elector into measures with them, but have not been able to effect it, that Prince plainly manifiesting his inclination as well as resolution to be, to unite with the Emperor for the preserving the Peace of the Empire. The report of the death of Abafti Prince of Transilvania is contradicted, he has been indeed very ill, but is now recovering; his death might probably have occasioned some alteration in Affairs on that fide.

Cologne, Feb. 28. The Marquis de Bourgomanero: Ambassadur from the King of Spain to the Emperor palled some days since by this place on his journey to Line; from whence we have advice, that the Conferences at Presbourg were separated, the matters that were there treated of, having been determined to the satisfaction of all sides, and that thereupon the Emperor had directed that the Orders necessary for the convening of the Dyet should be fortwith issued; and this good beginning made them hope that the faid Dyet would answer the great ends it is called for, by removing the dif-contents that have so long distracted that Kingdom. and by fetling Affairs to as that all Parties may unite in the promoting the common Interests, and consequently the Peace and happiness of that Country.

Hamburg, Feb. 25. The Elector and Electress of Saxony are at Postdam (having with them a Train of asa Persons) where they are very Magnificently Entertained by the Elector of Brand nburg: It is still very warmly discours'd, that an Alliance is Treating between the Elector and the Princes of Lunenburg , and that it's believed the Elector of Saxon will likewise-become a party in it. Our Letters from Dane= mark tell us, that the King in ended to take a jour-ncy to Holstein, and that several Troops which were to attend his Majesty in it had received their Orders to march. The Polish Letters bring not any thing of Moment.

Hague, March, 4. The Imperial Minister having presented

prefented a Memorial to the States-General, in which he defires they will order the payment of the Arrears of Subfidies which are due from them, to his Imperial Majesty, as also those due to the Elector of Trier, the States have resolved to send the said Memorial to the Provinces of Zealand, Friesland, and Groning n and to press them to take such speedy Orders for e payment of their Quota's of the faid Subfidies, which they are yet in Arrear, as that satisfaction m y be given to his Imperial Majelty and to the Eles or of Tier thereupon. The States of Holland are Adjourned till the 12th Instant; and th Prince rincels of Orange are gone to Soeftdike.
