

## LICENCES FOR DEALERS IN THREAD LACE.

Stamp-Office, July 26, 1806.

**H**IS Majesty's Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, that, in pursuance of an Act of the last Session of Parliament, Licences to the Dealers in Thread Lace of Foreign Manufacture, stamped with a Duty of 3*l.* 3*s.* and to the Dealers in Thread Lace of British Manufacture, stamped with a Duty of 5*s.* will, after the 1st Day of August next, be ready to be granted to such Persons as shall apply for the same, at the Head Office, in Somerset Place, or to the Distributers in the different Counties.

The Commissioners give further Notice, that all Persons so licensed are required to cause the Words "Dealer in Foreign Lace," or "Dealer in British Lace," as the Case may be, to be painted or written in large or legible Characters, either over the Door, or in some visible Place on the Front of his, her, or their House, Shop, or Warehouse.

N. B. A separate Licence must be taken out for each House, Shop, or Warehouse.
