. The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act "for making additional and surther Provision for "the effectual Performance of Quarantine," it is enacted that the Confuls and Vice Confuls of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, shall be, and are thereby, empowered to administer Oaths in all Cases. respecting Quarantine, in like Manner as if they were Magistrates of the several Towns or Places where they respectively reside: And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty that considerable Difficulties are experienced by the Merchants, Importers of Goods from Russia, in respect to making the Declarations on Oath, before a Magistrate of any Ports or Places in that Kingdom, required by Section 4.3 of His Majesty's Order in Council of Fifth of April, One thousand eight hundred and five, to ascertain whether certain Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes enumerated in the First Class of His Majesty's said Order in Council, imported in any Ships coming from any Port in Europe, without the Streights of Gibraltar, or on the Continent of America, are, or are not, the Growth, Produce, or Manufacture of Turkey, or of any Place in Africa within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary, on the Atlantic Ocean: And the like Difficulty occurs in respect to the special De-. clarations, required by His Majesty's Order in Council dated the Fisteenth of August last, in respect to any Rags imported into this Kingdom: And whereas fimilar Difficulties may occur touching the Trade from other Ports in Europe without the Streights of Gibraltar, or on the Continent of America; His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, is thereupon pleased to order, (and it is thereby ordered.) That if the Master, or other Perfon having Charge of any Ship or Veffel coming from any Port or Place at which there is no regular Establishment of Quarantine, declared sufficient by His Majesty in Council, shall bring with him a Desalaration on Oath, made by the Owner, Proprietor, Shipper, or Confignee of such Ship or Vessel, or of

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THEREAS by an Act, passed in the present Seffion of Parliament, intituled "An Act for making additional and further Provisions for the effectual Performance of Quarantine;" it is, amongst other Things, enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by His or Their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette, to prohibit all Persons, Ships, Boats, and Vessels whatsoever from going, under any Pretence what soever, within the Limits of any Station which, by His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, by any such Order or Orders in Council, has been, or may be affigned for the Performance of Quarantine, by any Ships or Vessels without Clean

Bills of Health; and that if any Person whatsoever, after such Notification or Publication of any such Order or Orders in Council, shall presume, under any Pretence whatsoever; to go with any Ship, Boat, or Vessel within the Limits of any such Station, he or she shall, for every such Offence, forseit and pay

the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds.

And whereas by His Majelly's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five, it is directed that all Ships of War, Transports, and other Ships in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of Commissioned Officers of His Majelly's Navy, coming from any of the Places mentioned in the faid Grder, and not being provided with clean Bills of Health, shall perform Quarantine at the Motherbank, in a separate and distinct Place, to be appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys for that Purpose; which Place has been appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys accordingly.

His Majesty, in Pursuance of the Powers vested in him by the said Act, is pleased, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That no Persons, Ships, Vessels, or Boats whatsoever, other than the Vessels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine, or his Assistant, or other Boats regularly employed, under the Authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in the Quarantine Service, shall go, under any Pretence whatsoever, within the Limits of the Place so marked out, except in Cases of special Necessity and Emergency, and with Permission first had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Assistant.

And it is hereby further ordered, That all Ships and Vessels being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the same at the Motherbank, shall come to Anchor within the Compass of the said Yellow Buoys, in such Place, or Places, as shall be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantine, or his Assistant, and shall be kept separate and apart from His Majesty's Ships of War, Transports, and Vessels in the Service of Government, and not having Clean Bills of Health, which may be performing Quarantine as aforesaid, within the Compass of the said Yellow Buoys:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

or to any Member, Creek, or Place belonging to, or within any or either of the above Ports, shall no longer perform Quarantine at Cromarty Bay, in the Murray Firth, but shall perform the same at Inverkeithing Bay; and that such Ships or Vessels as are bound to the South West Ports of Scotland, comprehending the Ports of

Dumfries and Kirkcudbright,

or to any Member, Creek, or other Place belonging to, or within either of those Ports, shall no longer perform their Quarantine at Carsthorn, at the Mouth of the River Nith, but shall perform the same at Holy Loch, in the Firth of Clyde:—And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

W Hereas it hath been humbly represented to the King, that on Saturday the 5th Instant Patrick Kennedy and James Kelly, Two Deserters from the Eighty-eighth Regiment, being pursued by John Carroll from Buckingham Gate towards Chelfea, for the Purpose of apprehending them, one of them did maliciously shoot at and wound the said John Carroll, of which Wound he is fince dead;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the faid Patrick Kennedy and James Kelly, or either of them, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to either of them, (except the one who assually shot the said John Carroll,) that shall discover

his Accomplice in the above Felony.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of ONE HUNDRED GUINEAS is hereby offered to any Person, (excepting as before excepted,) who shall apprehend the said Patrick Kennedy or James Kelly, on either of them being convided of having shot the said John Carroll, to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

The faid James Kelly is Twenty-eight Years of Age, Five Feet Six Inches high, born in the Parish of Dunnamore, in the County of Tyrone, in Ireland; flender Per-fon, long and remarkable fmall turning-up Chin, Hazle Eyes, dark Eyebrows, aquiline piqued Nose, small Mouth, black Hair, rather bow Legs; had on at the Time of his Defertion a Regimental Great Coat, a Waisscoat, and Russia-Duck Overalls.

The faid Patrick Kennedy is Twenty feven Years of Age, Five Feet Ten Inches high, born in the Parish of Dunackmore, in the County of Tyrone, in Ireland; slout and compact made, long Face, much freckled, blue Eyes, fair Eyebrows, rather large Mouth, dark fandy Hair; had on at the Time of his Defertion, a Regimental Great Coat and Waistcoat, and Russia-Duck Overalls.
