THIS Day the Right Honorable Henry Richard Lord Holland, was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Downing-Street, August 20, 1806.

The King has been pleased to appoint the Right Honorable Henry Richard Lord Holland and the Right Honorable William Lord Auckland, to be Joint Commissioners and Plenipotentiaries for arranging and finally settling the several Matters in Discussion between His Majesty's Government and the Government of the United States, with James Monroe and William Pinckney, Esquires, the Commissioners appointed for similar Purposes on the Part of the said United States:

The King has also been pleased to appoint the Honorable William Frederick Elliot Eden to be Secretary, and John Allen, Esq; to be Assistant-Secretary to the aforesaid Commission.

St. James's, August 30, 1806.

The King has been pleased to appoint Nathan Egerton Garrick, Esq; to be Lieutenant of the Yeomen of the Guard, vice Philip John Ducarel, Esq; resigned.
