

Notice is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session for Leave to bring in a Bill for making a Railway or Tram Road, and such other Works as may be necessary, for the Conveyance of Coal, Lime, Grain, Timber, Slates, and other Merchandize, and for other Purposes, from certain Mines and Estates of the Marquis and Marchioness, of Titchfield, and others, lying in the Parish of Kilmarnock and others, in the County of Ayr, to a Place called the Troon, or Troon Point, on the West Coast of the said County; and also to erect a Harbour at or about that Place, and to build Warehouses, Bridges, and other Works for the above Purposes:—And Notice is likewise given, that said Railway or Tram Road is intended to proceed from the Troon, through the Troon Lands and Lands of Burnfoot, belonging to the said Marquis and Marchioness, and then to pass through the Lands of Barraslee, and Hill House Parks, belonging to John McKerrall, Esquire; on the East and West Side of the Road from Ayr to Irvine; and from thence through the Lands of Auchens, Kellford, Boghde, and Girtridge, belonging to Lord and Lady Montgomery; and then through the Lands of Harperland, Lave Mill, Cockhill, Plowland, Fairlie, and Arrackill, belonging to Sir William Cunningham, Baronet; and from thence through the Lands of West and East Gatehead, belonging to the Earl of Eglinton; and then through the Lands of Thirdpart, Camsketh, Mount Burnbrae, Holmes, and Wards, or other Lands adjacent thereto; and which said Lands do lie in the Parishes of Irvine, Dundonald, Monkton, Riccarlow, Kilmairs, and Kilmarnock, within the said County of Ayr.

Aylesbury to the Grand Junction Canal in the Parish of Marlow, as aforesaid; and further to require and compel the said Corporation to apply such Sum, and Sums of Money as have been subscribed and paid some Years since to them, under the Covenant and Averment of the said Corporation, of their then Intention forthwith to proceed, and without Delay, to the making of a Communication from the said Town of Aylesbury to the Grand Junction Canal in the said Parish of Marlow, in the case of the above Sum of Twenty Thousand Two Hundred and Fifty-six Pounds, so engaged to be advanced for this Purpose, being found insufficient.
