N. B. 133. Richard Chase, Esq; whose Claim is taken Notice of under that of the Honorable Mrs. Johnston, No. 97, has now signed the Deed—The Bonds were assigned to him in Trust, to pay One-fourth of the Value to Paupiah Brahminy, as Creditor of Mr. Johnston; and the Remainder to Mr. Johnston himself.

Since the Publication of the former Part of this Schedule, in the Gazette of the 12th of August, the Commissioners have received an amended Statement of the Claim of John Tulloh, Esq; No. 46, in the Papers accompanying which, he observes, that "it never till lately occurred to him, that he had made a subsequent Settlement with the Nabob, in March 1794." The Claim as now made, stands thus: By Peryannah, dated 16th Shaban 1208, Hegry, which accumulates the Amount of Two Bonds of 23d May 1789, and 14th August 1790, together with Interest on each, from their respective Dates, and directs the Sum, with its accruing Interest, to be liquidated by Instalments in Eight Years, out of the Collections of Nather Nagur, (Trichinopoly,) the Principal of the Claim, dated from the Period of the final Instalment, 10th July 1801.

The Commissioners have likewise received, since the Publication of the former Part of the Schedule, a Notification from Mrs. Rebecca Sewell, whose Claim is No. 40, that the Bond of Omdut Ul Omrah there described, has been assigned by her to Colonel Treadway Clarke, who has signed the Deed, and is to be considered accordingly as the Claimant under—No. 40.
