NOTICE is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Sessions for an Act for further enlarging, altering, and amending the Powers and Provisions of Two several Acts, passed respectively in the Forty-third and Forty-sixth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled, respectively, "An Act for improving and rendering more commodious the Port and Harbour of Bristol;" and "An Act to alter and amend an Act, passed in the Forty-third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for improving and rendering more commodious the Port and Harbour of Bristol, and for extending the Powers and Provisions of the said Act;" in which new Act it is intended to make Provision for varying and altering the Works authorized and directed to be made in and by the said recited Act, by erecting a Swivel or Drawbridge across the intended Floating Harbour, from the end of Princess-Street, at or near the Gib Slip, to Wapping; and also by making Buttresses for the said Swivel or Drawbridge with Grooves, to receive a Floating Gate or Caisson, so as at any Time to draw off the Water, and cleanse the Harbour on either Side of the said intended Bridge; and also by making and maintaining a Road or Way from the said intended

Bridge, through that Part of the Parish of Bedminster which lies within the City of Bristol, to communicate with the intended Road on the North Side of the New River, and by erecting a Gate or Gates on the said Bridge or Road; and receiving Tolls thereon, and on the Fowing Paths; and also for altering and increasing the Rates on Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes imported from Parts beyond the Seas, granted by the said recited Act, or laying new Rates on such Goods, Wares, and Merchandizes in lieu of all or some of the present Rates.

NOTICE is hereby given, that Application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next Session for an Act, for amending, altering, and enlarging the Powers of Two Acts, the one passed in the Fourteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act more effectually to improve and complete the Navigation of the River Thames Westward of London Bridge, within the Liberties of the City of London, and to prevent any Vessel or Barge from being moored in Taplow Mill Stream, in the County of Bucks;" and the other, passed in the Seventeenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for enabling the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London to purchase the present Tolls and Duties payable for navigating upon the River Thames Westward of London Bridge, within the Liberties of the City of London, and for laying a small Toll in lieu thereof, for the Purpose of more effectually completing the said Navigation, and for other Purposes;" in which new Act it is intended to provide for the making of certain Cuts from Parts of the said River, to other Parts thereof, for the Purpose of avoiding the Places where the Navigation is most obstructed, and least capable of being otherwise improved; which Cuts are proposed to be made in the several Parishes of Laleham, Littleton, Shepperton, and Sunbury, in the County of Middlesex, and Chertsey, Thorp. West Moulsey, East Moulsey, and Kingston-upon-Thames, in the County of Surrey:

And also for an Act for the Enlargement and better regulating of Smithfield Market, in the City of London, and for empowering the Corporation of London to purchase Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments adjoining to or near the said Market Place, for the Purpose of enlarging the same; and also for an Act or Acts for altering and enlarging the Powers of an Act, passed in the Thirty-ninth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for rendering more commodious, and for better regulating, the Port of London;" and of several other Acts since passed, extending the Provisions of the said Act. *T.
