His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in such barbarous Murder, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, (except the Person who actually committed the same,) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
