Copy of a Letter from Vice-Admiral Dacres, Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels at Jamaica, to William Marsden, Esq; dated at Port Royal, August 3, 1806.

SIR,

I TRANSMIT herewith, for the Information of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, Copies of Two Letters I have received from Lieutenant Rorie, commanding His Majesty's Brig Morne Fortunée, acquainting me of his having captured a French Privateer Schooner, and driven on Shore and destroyed a Spanish Armed Schooner, with a Letter of Marque. *His Majesty's Brig Morne Fortunée, off Beata, May 16, 1806.*

SIR,

I BEG Leave to inform you, that His Majesty's Brig under my Command, after a Chace of Two Hours, captured the French Privateer Le Luni, mounting Two Carriage Guns, with a Complement of Forty-seven Men, out Four Days from the City of St. Domingo, without making any Captures.

*His Majesty's Brig Morne Fortunée, off Island Mona, June 8, 1806.*

SIR,

I HAVE the Honor to acquaint you, His Majesty's Brig under my Command drove on Shore, on the 3d Instant, between the Island of Saona and Cape Enganna, the Spanish Letter of Marque Schooner L'Amable Jenette, mounting Two Six Pounders, with a Complement of Twenty Men.

It being impossible to get her off, I sent the Boats to destroy her, under the Command of Sub-Lieutenant Kingston, which Service he accomplished much to my Satisfaction.
